A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 Section 6E-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§6E-3 Historic preservation program. There is 4 established within the department a division to administer a 5 comprehensive historic preservation program, which shall include 6 but not be limited to the following: 7 (1)Development of an ongoing program of historical, architectural, and archaeological research and development, including surveys, excavations, 10 scientific recording, interpretation, signage, and 11 publications on the State's historical and cultural 12 resources; 13 Acquisition of historic or cultural properties, real (2) 14 or personal, in fee or in any lesser interest, by 15 gift, purchase, condemnation, devise, bequest, land 16 exchange, or other means; preservation, restoration, 17 administration, or transference of the property; and

1		the charging of reasonable admissions to that
2 .		property;
3	(3)	Development of a statewide survey and inventory to
4		identify and document historic properties, aviation
5		artifacts, and burial sites, including all those owned
6		by the State and the counties;
7	(4)	Preparation of information for the Hawaii register of
8		historic places and listing on the national register
9		of historic places;
10	(5)	Preparation, review, and revisions of a state historic
l1		preservation plan, including budget requirements and
12		land use recommendations;
13	(6)	Application for and receipt of gifts, grants,
14		technical assistance, and other funding from public
15		and private sources for the purposes of this chapter;
16	(7)	Provision of technical and financial assistance to the
17		counties and public and private agencies involved in
18		historic preservation activities;
19	(8)	Coordination of activities of the counties in
20		accordance with the state plan for historic
21		preservation;

1	(9)	Stimulation of public interest in historic
2		preservation, including the development and
3		implementation of interpretive programs for historic
4		properties listed on or eligible for the Hawaii
5		register of historic places;
6	(10)	Coordination of the evaluation and management of
7		burial sites as provided in section 6E-43;
8	(11)	Acquisition of burial sites in fee or in any lesser
9		interest, by gift, purchase, condemnation, devise,
10		bequest, land exchange, or other means, to be held in
11		trust;
12	(12)	Submittal of an annual report to the governor and
13		legislature detailing the accomplishments of the year,
14		recommendations for changes in the state plan or
15		future programs relating to historic preservation, and
16		an accounting of all income, expenditures, and the
17		fund balance of the Hawaii historic preservation
18		special fund;
19	(13)	Regulation of archaeological activities throughout the
20		State;
21	(14)	Employment of sufficient professional and technical
22		staff for the purposes of this chapter which [may],

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1		except as provided in section 6E-5, shall be in
2		accordance with chapter 76;
3	(15)	The charging of fees to be determined by the
4		department that are proportional to the nature and
5		complexity of the projects or services provided, and
6		adjusted from time to time to ensure that the
7		proceeds, together with all other fines, income, and
8		penalties collected under this chapter, do not surpass
9		the annual operating costs of the comprehensive
10		historic preservation program;
11	(16)	Adoption of rules in accordance with chapter 91,
12		necessary to carry out the purposes of this chapter;
13		and
14	(17)	Development and adoption, in consultation with the
15		office of Hawaiian affairs native historic
16	•	preservation council, of rules governing permits for
17		access by native Hawaiians and Hawaiians to cultural,
18		historic, and pre-contact sites and monuments."
