A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE HAWAII CONSTITUTION TO PERMIT THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES TO APPOINT MEMBERS TO A BOARD, COMMISSION, OR OTHER BODY THAT IS THE HEAD OF A PRINCIPAL EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to propose an
- 2 amendment to article V, section 6 of the Constitution of the
- 3 State of Hawaii to permit the president of the senate and
- 4 speaker of the house of representatives to appoint members to a
- 5 board, commission, or other body that is the head of a principal
- 6 executive department, as provided by law.
- 7 SECTION 2. Article V, section 6, of the Constitution of
- the State of Hawaii is amended to read as follows: 8

9 "EXECUTIVE AND ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICES

10 AND DEPARTMENTS

- 11 **Section 6.** All executive and administrative offices,
- 12 departments and instrumentalities of the state government and
- 13 their respective powers and duties shall be allocated by law
- 14 among and within not more than twenty principal departments in
- 15 such a manner as to group the same according to common purposes
- 16 and related functions. Temporary commissions or agencies for



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- 1 special purposes may be established by law and need not be
- 2 allocated within a principal department.
- 3 Each principal department shall be under the supervision of
- 4 the governor and, unless otherwise provided in this constitution
- 5 or by law, shall be headed by a single executive. Such single
- 6 executive shall be nominated and, by and with the advice and
- 7 consent of the senate, appointed by the governor. That person
- 8 shall hold office for a term to expire at the end of the term
- 9 for which the governor was elected, unless sooner removed by the
- 10 governor; except that the removal of the chief legal officer of
- 11 the State shall be subject to the advice and consent of the
- 12 senate.
- 13 Except as otherwise provided in this constitution, whenever
- 14 a board, commission or other body shall be the head of a
- 15 principal department of the state government, the members
- 16 thereof shall be nominated and, by and with the advice and
- 17 consent of the senate, appointed by the governor [-], president
- 18 of the senate, or speaker of the house of representatives, as
- 19 provided by law. The term of office and removal of such members
- 20 shall be as provided by law. Such board, commission or other
- 21 body may appoint a principal executive officer who, when
- 22 authorized by law, may be an ex officio, voting member thereof,



- 1 and who may be removed by a majority vote of the members
- 2 [appointed by the governor].
- 3 The governor shall nominate and, by and with the advice and
- 4 consent of the senate, appoint all officers for whose election
- 5 or appointment provision is not otherwise provided for by this
- 6 constitution or by law. If the manner of removal of an officer
- 7 is not prescribed in this constitution, removal shall be as
- 8 provided by law.
- 9 When the senate is not in session and a vacancy occurs in
- 10 any office, appointment to which requires the confirmation of
- 11 the senate, the governor may fill the office by granting a
- 12 commission which shall expire, unless such appointment is
- 13 confirmed, at the end of the next session of the senate. The
- 14 person so appointed shall not be eligible for another interim
- 15 appointment to such office if the appointment failed to be
- 16 confirmed by the senate.
- 17 No person who has been nominated for appointment to any
- 18 office and whose appointment has not received the consent of the
- 19 senate shall be eligible to an interim appointment thereafter to
- 20 such office.
- 21 Every officer appointed under the provisions of this
- 22 section shall be a citizen of the United States and shall have

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- 1 been a resident of this State for at least one year immediately
- 2 preceding that person's appointment, except that this residency
- 3 requirement shall not apply to the president of the University
- 4 of Hawaii."
- 5 SECTION 3. The question to be printed on the ballot shall
- 6 be as follows:
- 7 "Shall the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House
- 8 of Representatives, in addition to the Governor, be permitted to
- 9 appoint members, as provided by law, to a board, commission, or
- 10 other body that is the head of a principal executive
- 11 department?"
- 12 SECTION 4. Constitutional material to be repealed is
- 13 bracketed and stricken. New constitutional material is
- 14 underscored.
- 15 SECTION 5. This amendment shall take effect upon
- 16 compliance with article XVII, section 3, of the Constitution of
- 17 the State of Hawaii.
