A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the 2013 tax review
 commission concluded that a comprehensive review of Hawaii's tax
 structure was necessary to determine how the structure fared
 during the recent recession and whether it was adequate to meet
 the needs of the twenty-first century.

6 One recommendation of the tax review commission was to 7 establish a commission similar to the federal government's 8 national commission of fiscal responsibility and reform, also 9 known as the Simpson-Bowles commission, with authority to review 10 and make recommendations on expenditures and revenue 11 enhancement.

12 The tax review commission noted that the tax burden on 13 Hawaii's taxpayers would be severe if the approach was solely to 14 enhance revenue. The expenditure component therefore must be 15 part of a solution that promotes long term financial stability 16 and prosperity for the State and its residents.

SECT	ION 2. (a) There is established the state commission
on fiscal	responsibility and reform within the department of
taxation	for administrative purposes.
(b)	The state commission on fiscal responsibility and
reform sh	all consist of the following members:
(1)	Two members to be appointed by the governor;
(2)	Two members of the senate, to be appointed by the
	president of the senate; provided that one member so
	appointed shall be a sitting senator and shall serve
	as co-chair of the commission;
(3)	Two members of the house of representatives, to be
	appointed by the speaker of the house of
	representatives; provided that one member so appointed
	shall be a sitting representative and shall serve as
	co-chair of the commission;
(4)	The director of taxation or the director's designee;
(5)	One member from the Legal Aid Society of Hawaii; and
(6)	One member from the Tax Foundation of Hawaii.
