

# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	HAWAII HEALTH AUTHORITY
6	§ -1 Hawaii health authority; establishment. (a) There
7	is established within the department of health for
8	administrative purposes the Hawaii health authority. The
9	authority shall be an autonomous public body corporate and
10	politic and an instrumentality of the State.
11	(b) The authority shall be composed of nine members
12	appointed by the governor as provided in section 26-34; provided
13	that:
14	(1) Two members shall represent the health care industry;
15	(2) Two members shall be practicing physicians;
16	(3) Two members shall represent public health
17	professionals; and
18	(4) Three members shall represent the community at large.

- 1 Each member shall be appointed for a term of four years and
- 2 shall hold office until the member's successor is appointed.
- 3 (c) The authority shall elect a chairperson from among its
- 4 members. Five members shall constitute a quorum, whose
- 5 affirmative vote shall be necessary for all valid actions by the
- 6 authority.
- 7 (d) The members shall serve without compensation but may
- 8 be reimbursed for expenses, including travel expenses, incurred
- 9 in the performance of their duties.
- (e) The authority may appoint and set the salary of an
- 11 executive director who shall be exempt from chapters 76, 78, and
- **12** 89.
- 13 § -2 Hawaii health authority; duties and
- 14 responsibilities. (a) The authority shall be responsible for
- 15 overall health planning for the State and shall provide guidance
- 16 to the governor and the director of health.
- 17 (b) The authority shall develop a comprehensive health
- 18 plan to include:
- 19 (1) Current and long-term capacity needs of health
- 20 providers, facilities, equipment, and support services
- 21 providers;

- 1 (2) Recommendations for the ongoing operations of the
  2 Hawaii Health Connector;
- 3 (3) Initiatives to increase the number of primary care
  4 physicians in Hawaii, including loan repayment
  5 programs to maximize federal support;
- (4) Recommendations regarding patient-centered medical
   homes; and
- 8 (5) Other health-related recommendations and initiatives,9 as appropriate.
- 10 (c) The authority may seek waivers of federal laws, rules,
  11 or regulations necessary to implement and maintain the
  12 provisions of this chapter.
- (d) The authority shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91necessary for the purposes of this chapter.
- (e) The authority shall submit a comprehensive health
  plan, including findings, recommendations, budget requirements,
  and proposed implementing legislation, to the governor, the
  director of health, and the legislature no later than twenty
  days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2015, and
- 19 days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2015, and
- 21 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
