A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE INNOVATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1	The	legislature	finds	that	Hawaii	is	in	need	of
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- 2 a more robust, resilient, and self-sufficient agricultural
- 3 industry that promotes the State's food security policies.
- 4 Supporting and nurturing local agricultural innovation and
- 5 awarding financial resources to businesses will, among other
- 6 things, bring to the market new technology to further the
- 7 State's food self-sufficiency goals.
- 8 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish an
- 9 innovation grant program for agricultural innovation.
- 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 206M, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 12 to read as follows:
- 13 "PART . AGRICULTURE INNOVATION GRANT PROGRAM
- 14 §206M-A Agriculture innovation grant program;
- 15 establishment. There is established the agriculture innovation
- 16 grant program to fund agribusiness incubator programs for the
- 17 support of start-up agricultural businesses developing

4	outside of the State.
5	Applications that show evidence of demonstration funding, cost
6	share, or additional funds already secured shall receive more
7	favorable consideration. Such applications shall provide the
8	source, amount, timing, and degree of certainty for any funds
9	secured outside of the agriculture innovation grant.
10	(c) Agriculture innovation grants shall be awarded by the
11	board subject to available funds in the agriculture innovation
12	grant fund established under section 206M-C.
13	(d) An applicant who receives an agriculture innovation
14	grant may apply to renew the grant. Applications for renewal
15	shall include a report detailing the success of the agribusiness
16	incubator program.
17	(e) The board shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 to
18	(1) Specify an application procedure and timeline for the
19	agriculture innovation grant program;
20	(2) Develop a procedure by which to rate applications and

- 2 direct and indirect costs associated with the agriculture
- 3 innovation grant program; provided that no more than one per
- 4 cent of the total amount of moneys annually appropriated from
- 5 the fund shall be used to offset administrative costs incurred
- 6 by the board to implement and sustain the agriculture innovation
- 7 grant program.
- §206M-D Agriculture innovation grant program; reporting.
- 9 Following each fiscal year in which the board awards one or more
- 10 agriculture innovation grants, the board shall submit a report
- 11 to the legislature describing, at a minimum, the agribusiness
- 12 incubator programs receiving a grant, the amount awarded to each
- 13 program, and the results achieved by each program. The report
- 14 shall be submitted no later than twenty days prior to the
- 15 convening of the next regular session."
- 16 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 18 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 to be
- 19 deposited into the agriculture innovation grant fund.
- 20 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the agriculture
- 21 innovation grant fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as

- 1 may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for the purposes of
- 2 the agriculture innovation grant program.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
- 5 this Act.
- 6 SECTION 5. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 7 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 8 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 9 the new sections in this Act.
- 10 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.

Report Title:

Agriculture Innovation Grant Program and Fund; Appropriation

Description:

Establishes an Agriculture Innovation Grant Program and Agriculture Innovation Grant Fund to fund agribusiness incubator programs to support start-up businesses in Hawaii focused on feed production, food waste recycling, on-farm energy efficiency, soil health and conservation, and food related agricultural activities. Makes an appropriation. Effective July 1, 2014. (HB1534 HD1)

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
