A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State needs to
- 2 provide opportunities for youth to enter the agricultural
- 3 sector, much like the youth conservation corps that has
- 4 demonstrated success in creating pathways for youth to enter
- 5 into leadership positions in the conservation sector. The
- 6 legislature finds that a Hawaii youth agricultural corps would
- 7 provide service and workforce development that significantly
- 8 differs from current agriculture focused educational programs,
- 9 thereby opening the door for non-traditional learners to enter
- 10 the agricultural sector.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of
- 12 agriculture to issue a request for proposals to local non-profit
- 13 organizations that have a demonstrated capacity in youth-
- 14 oriented service programming for agriculture to establish,
- 15 develop, and implement a Hawaii youth agricultural corps.
- 16 SECTION 2. (a) The department of agriculture shall issue
- 17 a request for proposals for local non-profit organizations that
- 18 have a demonstrated capacity in youth-oriented service

4	(b) A local, non-profit organization establishing a Hawaii		
5	youth agricultural corps program may request assistance from the		
6	department of education and other relevant organizations and		
7	agencies in performing its objectives.		
8	(c) The chairperson of the board of agriculture may adopt,		
9	amend, or repeal rules, pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised		
10	Statutes, for purposes of this Act, including providing for the		
11	request for proposals requirements included in this section.		
12	(d) As used in this Act:		
13	"Program" means the Hawaii youth agricultural corps		
14	program.		
15	"Youth" means high school and college students.		
16	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general		
17	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much		
18	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for the		
19	costs associated with the Hawaii youth agricultural corps		
20	program.		

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of

agriculture for the purposes of this Act.

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1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
