A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY'S ADMINISTRATION OF THE HOUSING CHOICE VOUCHER PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to provide fair
2	opportunities for people on the waiting list to receive housing
3	choice voucher program vouchers.
4	SECTION 2. Chapter 356D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
6	and to read as follows:
7	" <u>\$356D-</u> Housing choice voucher program administration.
8	Any housing choice voucher program voucher issued by the
9	authority shall automatically terminate upon the death or
10	removal from assistance of the last household member; provided
11	that, where the original head or co-head of the household is
12	survived by a minor who was subsequently added to the household
13	by birth, adoption, or court order and the family properly
14	reported the birth, adoption, or court order to the authority,
15	the household may retain the voucher until the youngest minor
16	added to the household reaches the age of twenty-one, or reaches
17	the age of twenty-three if the youngest minor is a full-time





1	student at a business school, technical school, college,
2	community college, or university. Any legal guardian added to
3	the household shall not retain the voucher after the youngest
4	minor has reached the age of twenty-one, or has reached the age
5	of twenty-three if the youngest minor is a full-time student at
6	a business school, technical school, college, community college,
7	<u>or university.</u> "
8	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
9	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2525.
