15	"Major and adjudicated patient care violation" means any		
16	violation that has been adjudicated and in which there is gross		
17	negligence, wilful and wanton misconduct, or intentional		
18	misconduct, including financial abuse.

Department of Health; Website Information; Care Homes Violations

Description:

Authorizes the Department of Health, beginning January 1, 2016, to post on its website information concerning a major and adjudicated patient care violation when the order specifying the violation is final and the violation was discovered in specified state-licensed care facilities, adult day care centers, and community care foster family homes. Effective July 1, 2014.
