A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TUITION WAIVERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 304A-502, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended t	o read as follows:
3	" [-[]	§304A-502[] Power of regents to grant tuition
4	waivers.	(a) The board of regents, or its designated
5	represent	atives, is authorized to grant, modify, or suspend
6	tuition w	aivers.
7	The	board may:
8	(1)	Waive entirely or reduce the tuition fee or any of the
9		other fees for graduate teaching and research
10		assistants;
11	(2)	Enter into agreements with government and university
12		officials of any other state or foreign country to
13		provide for reciprocal waiver of the nonresident
14		tuition and fee differential;
15	(3)	Waive the nonresident tuition and fee differential for
16		selected students from Pacific and Asian jurisdictions
17		when their presence would be beneficial to the
18		university or the State;

1	(4)	Waive entirely or reduce the tuition fee or any of the
2		other fees for students, resident or nonresident; and
3	(5)	Waive the nonresident tuition and fee differential for
4		members in good standing of the following military
5		units, regardless of their actual state of residence:
6		(A) The Hawaii national guard; and
7		(B) The federal reserve components of the Army, Navy,
8		Air Force, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard who
9		attend drills with units located within the
10		State.
11	The board	shall determine the percentage of allowable tuition
12	and fee w	aivers for financial need and other university
13	prioritie	s. These tuition waivers and waivers of the
14	nonreside	nt tuition and fee differential shall be awarded in
15	accordance	e with guidelines established by the board.
16	(b)	The board of regents shall waive entirely the tuition
17	fee and a	ny other fees for a qualified student who is a resident
18	of the St	ate and a spouse or child of:
19	(1)	An eligible veteran or national guard member who
20		became totally disabled as a result of serving in
21		active federal military service; or

1	(2)	An active or reserve member of the armed forces or
2		national guard who was killed while engaged in active
3		federal military service; provided that upon
4		remarriage, the surviving spouse of the armed services
5	;	or national guard member shall no longer be eligible
6		for the fee waivers provided under this subsection."

9	SECTI	ION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
