### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE BUILDING CODE.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

The state building code council was created in 1 SECTION 1. 2007, to review and adopt a comprehensive suite of the latest 2 3 editions of nationally recognized building codes and standards for the State of Hawaii. The staff and operating expenses of 4 5 the council have never been funded, thereby limiting the effectiveness of the work of the nine voting members, who are 6 state and county government regulators and private stakeholders. 7 8 This Act adds building industry and trade representatives to the 9 council membership, allows for the staggering of the code adoption time frame, defines and clarifies terminology, ensures 10 11 that the laws governing building contractors do not conflict 12 with the Hawaii state building codes, and makes an appropriation 13 to fund the operations of the council.

14 SECTION 2. Section 107-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 amended to read as follows:

16 1. By adding two new definitions to be appropriately17 inserted and to read:

14	SECTION 3. Section 107-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
15	amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:		
16	"(a) There is established a state building code council.		
17	The council shall be placed within the department of accounting		
18	and general services for administrative purposes only. The		
19	council shall consist of [nine] eleven voting members and one		
20	nonvoting member, who shall be the comptroller or the		
21	comptroller's designee. The council members shall serve four-

(b) 5 The chairperson of the council shall be elected annually from among its members by a majority vote of the members of the 6 7 council." SECTION 4. Section 107-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 9 amended to read as follows: 10 "[+]\$107-23[+] Executive director and executive assistant. (a) The council shall appoint, exempt from chapters 76 and 89, 11 an executive director, who shall serve at the pleasure of the 12 council, and who shall have administrative abilities and 13 14 [expertise in engineering or architecture.] experience with the 15 building industry. The council shall also appoint, exempt from chapters 76 and 89, an executive assistant, who shall have 16 experience in statutory and administrative rulemaking 17 18 processes [-] to assist in carrying out the duties of the council 19 under section 107-24. Other staff personnel may be appointed, but shall not be exempt from chapters 76 and 89. 20 21 The budgetary requirements for conducting meetings, (b) 22 training, travel, and other related functions of the council, HB LRB 14-0450.doc

2	assistant, and other staff personnel, shall be included in the			
3	budget of the department of accounting and general services."			
4	SECTION 5. Section 107-24, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
5	amended to read as follows:			
6	"[ <del>[</del> ]§107-24[ <del>]</del> ] Authority and duties of the council. (a)			
7	Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, the council shall			
8	establish [ <del>a comprehensive</del> ] <u>the Hawaii</u> state building [ <del>code.</del> ]			
9	codes.			
10	(b) The council shall appoint a subcommittee comprised of			
11	the four council members representing county building officials,			
12	whose duty shall be to recommend any necessary or desirable			
13	state amendments to the $[model]$ codes $[-]$ and standards			
14	identified in section 107-25. Any recommended state amendments			
15	shall require the unanimous agreement of the subcommittee. The			
16	council shall designate the staggering of the codes and			
17	standards to be adopted, amended, and updated. The frequency of			
18	the adoption of any code or standard shall not exceed every six			
19	years. Any recommended staggering of adoptions shall be based			
20	on a review and evaluation of the utility of each code and			
21	standard identified in section 107-25 when each edition is			
22	published.			



The council may appoint other investigative, technical 1 (C) expertise committees, which may include council members. 2 The council shall consult with [qeneral] building 3 (d) contractor associations and building trade associations to 4 5 gather information and recommendations on construction practices and training relevant to building codes and standards. 6 7 [-(-e) The council shall review and adopt, as appropriate, new-model building-codes within eighteen months of-the official 8 9 publication-date. (f) (e) The council may make expenditures for technical 10 references, equipment and supplies, and other operating 11 expenses, and may contract for the conduct of research studies 12 13 and other technical services. 14 [<del>(q)</del>] (f) The council [shall] may provide education and technical training and administrative assistance in the form of 15 services or grants at the state and county levels relating to 16 the implementation and enforcement of the Hawaii state building 17 18 [code] codes adopted pursuant to this part. (g) At the close of each fiscal year, the council shall 19

20 make a written report to the governor on its activities,

21 including the codes and standards established by the council."

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"[+]§107-28[+] County [building code] authority to amend 1 2 and adopt the Hawaii state [model] building [code] codes without [state] council approval. (a) The governing body of each 3 county shall amend, adopt, and update the Hawaii state building 4 5 [code] codes as it applies within its respective jurisdiction, 6 in accordance with section 46-1.5(13), without approval of the 7 council. Each county shall [use] amend and adopt the [model] Hawaii state building codes and standards listed in section 107-8 9 25, as the referenced [model] Hawaii state building codes and 10 standards for its respective county building code ordinance, no later than two years after the adoption of [the] each Hawaii 11 12 state building code. If a county does not amend the [statewide model code] 13 (b) 14 Hawaii state building codes within the two-year time frame, the 15 Hawaii state building [code] codes shall become applicable as an interim county building code [until the county adopts the 16 17 amendments]." SECTION 10. There is appropriated out of the general 18

19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000 or so much 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for the 21 operations of the state building code council, including



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salaries for staff personnel, training, travel, and technical
assistance services.

3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of4 accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act.

5 SECTION 11. This Act does not affect rights and duties 6 that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that 7 were begun before its effective date.

8 SECTION 12. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

10 SECTION 13. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
