# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE BUILDING CODE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The state building code council was created in
- 2 2007 to review and adopt a comprehensive suite of the latest
- 3 editions of nationally recognized building codes and standards
- 4 for the State of Hawaii. The staff and operating expenses of
- 5 the council have never been funded, thereby limiting the
- 6 effectiveness of the work of the nine voting members, who are
- 7 state and county government regulators and private stakeholders.
- 8 This Act adds building industry and trade representatives to the
- 9 council membership, allows for the staggering of the code
- 10 adoption time frame, defines and clarifies terminology, ensures
- 11 that the laws governing building contractors do not conflict
- 12 with the Hawaii state building codes, and makes an appropriation
- 13 to fund the operations of the council.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 107-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended as follows:
- 1. By adding two new definitions to be appropriately
- 17 inserted and to read:

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         ""Codes and standards" means nationally recognized minimum
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    requirements for design and construction to safeguard life,
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    property, and the general welfare.
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         "Hawaii state building codes" means the building codes and
    standards that the state building code council adopts under

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         2. By amending the definition of "hurricane resistive
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    criteria" to read:
         ""Hurricane [resistive] resistant criteria" means the
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    design criteria for enhanced hurricane protection areas that are

    capable of withstanding a five hundred-year hurricane event, as

    developed by the state department of defense for public shelter
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    and residential safe room design criteria."
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         SECTION 3. Section 107-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
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         "(a) There is established a state building code council.
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    The council shall be placed within the department of accounting
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    and general services for administrative purposes only. The
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    council shall consist of [nine] eleven voting members and one
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    nonvoting member, who shall be the comptroller or the
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comptroller's designee. The council members shall serve four-

21		Association of Hawaii who has significant experience
22		with building codes; and

- 1 (8) One member representing the Subcontractors Association 2 of Hawaii who has significant experience with building 3 codes. [Six] Seven voting members shall constitute a quorum. 4 The chairperson of the council shall be elected annually from 5 among its members by a majority vote of the members of the 6 7 council." SECTION 4. Section 107-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended to read as follows: 9 "[+][107-23[+] Executive director and executive assistant. 10 The council shall appoint, exempt from chapters 76 and 89, 11 an executive director, who shall serve at the pleasure of the 12 council, and who shall have administrative abilities and 13 [expertise in engineering or architecture.] experience with the 14 building industry. The council shall also appoint, exempt from 15 chapters 76 and 89, an executive assistant, who shall have 16 experience in statutory and administrative rulemaking 17 processes[-] to assist in carrying out the duties of the council 18 under section 107-24. Other staff personnel may be appointed, 19 but shall not be exempt from chapters 76 and 89. 20 (b) The budgetary requirements for conducting meetings, 21 training, travel, and other related functions of the council, 22
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    including salaries of the executive director, executive
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    assistant, and other staff personnel, shall be included in the
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    budget of the department of accounting and general services."
         SECTION 5. Section 107-24, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended to read as follows:
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         "[+]$107-24[+] Authority and duties of the council. (a)
    Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, the council shall
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    establish [a comprehensive] the Hawaii state building [code.]

              The council shall appoint a subcommittee [comprised]
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    composed of the four council members representing county
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    building officials, whose duty shall be to recommend any
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    necessary or desirable state amendments to the [model] codes[-]
13
    and standards identified in section 107-25. Any recommended
14
    state amendments shall require the unanimous agreement of the
15
    subcommittee. The council shall designate a staggered schedule
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    for the codes and standards to be adopted, amended, and updated.
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    The frequency of the adoption of any code or standard shall not
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    exceed every three years. Any recommended staggering of
    adoptions shall be based on a review and evaluation of the
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    utility of each code and standard identified in section 107-25
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when each edition is published.

- 1 (c) The council may appoint other investigative, technical
- 2 expertise committees, which may include council members.
- 3 (d) The council shall consult with [general] building
- 4 contractor associations and building trade associations to
- 5 gather information and recommendations on construction practices
- 6 and training relevant to building codes and standards.
- 7 (e) The council shall review and adopt, as appropriate,
- 8 new model building codes within eighteen months of the official
- 9 publication date.
- 10 (f) The council may make expenditures for technical
- 11 references, equipment and supplies, and other operating
- 12 expenses, and may contract for the conduct of research studies
- 13 and other technical services.
- 14 (g) The council [shall] may provide education and
- 15 technical training and administrative assistance in the form of
- 16 services or grants at the state and county levels relating to
- 17 the implementation and enforcement of the Hawaii state building
- 18 [code] codes adopted pursuant to this part.
- 19 (h) At the close of each fiscal year, the council shall
- 20 make a written report to the governor on its activities,
- 21 including the codes and standards established by the council."

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    amended to read as follows:

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    [state] council approval. (a) The governing body of each
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    county shall amend, adopt, and update the Hawaii state building
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    [code] codes as [it-applies] applicable within its respective
    jurisdiction, in accordance with section 46-1.5(13), without
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    approval of the council. Each county shall [use] amend and
    adopt the [model] Hawaii state building codes and standards
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    listed in section 107-25, as the referenced [model] Hawaii state
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    building codes and standards for its respective county building
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    code ordinance, no later than two years after the adoption of
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    [the] each Hawaii state building code.
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              If a county does not amend the [statewide model code]
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    Hawaii state building codes within the two-year time frame, the
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    Hawaii state building [codes shall become applicable as an
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    interim county building code [until the county adopts the
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    amendments]."
         SECTION 10. There is appropriated out of the general
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    revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of $ or so much
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    thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for the
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- 1 operations of the state building code council, including
- 2 salaries for staff personnel, training, travel, and technical
- 3 assistance services.
- 4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 5 accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 11. This Act does not affect rights and duties
- 7 that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that
- 8 were begun before its effective date.
- 9 SECTION 12. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 13. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
