and who has been convicted of any of the offenses enumerated 1 2 above on at least three prior and separate occasions within [three] five years of the date of the commission of the present 3 offense, shall be sentenced to no less than [nine months] three 4 5 years of imprisonment. Whenever a court sentences a defendant 6 under this subsection for an offense under section 707-733, the court shall order the defendant to participate in a sex offender 7 8 assessment and, if recommended based on the assessment,

9 participate in the sex offender treatment program established by 10 chapter 353E."
