A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 The legislature finds that unmanned aircraft SECTION 1.
- systems are emerging technologies that have the potential to 2
- 3 transform America by providing wide ranging economic,
- environmental, safety, and security benefits. However, along 4
- with these benefits come concerns about individual privacy. 5
- While there is an existing body of federal, state, and local law 6
- relating to privacy, the question arises whether existing law is 7
- 8 adequate to alleviate the concerns of state legislators and
- citizens regarding privacy rights in light of this new 9
- 10 technology.
- The purpose of this Act is to adopt the recommendations of 11
- 12 the Aerospace States Association, the Council of State
- Governments, and the National Conference of State Legislatures 13
- regarding privacy considerations arising from the emergence of 14
- 15 unmanned aircraft systems.
- SECTION 2. Chapter 52D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16
- 17 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 18 and to read as follows:

1 International Association of Chiefs of Police 2 Aviation Committee; unmanned aircraft systems guidelines. The chief of police shall implement the International Association of 3 4 Chiefs of Police Aviation Committee's "Recommended Guidelines for 5 the use of Unmanned Aircraft." 6 SECTION 3. Chapter 263, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 7 amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately 8 designated and to read as follows: 9 "§263-A Operating an unmanned aircraft system or model aircraft so as to cause a nuisance; penalty. (a) It shall be 10 unlawful for any person to operate an unmanned aircraft system or 11 12 model aircraft across or above the State in a manner that 13 constitutes a nuisance to either the public, a person, or the property of a person. For the purposes of this section, 14 "nuisance" shall have the same meaning as defined in section 165-15 16 2. 17 (b) Any person violating this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall punishable by a fine of not more than 18 19 \$1,000, imprisonment for not more than one year, or both. \$263-B Firearm aboard unmanned aircraft system used for 20 21 commercial purposes; prohibited; penalty. (a) It shall be 22 unlawful for any person to install or carry any firearm aboard HB LRB 14-0599.doc

3	(b) Any person violating this section shall be guilty of
4	class C felony.
5	(c) As used in this section, "firearm" shall have the same
6	meaning as in section 134-1."
7	SECTION 4. Section 711-1111, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended as follows:
9	1. By amending subsection (1) to read as follows:
10	"(1) A person commits the offense of violation of privac
11	in the second degree if, except in the execution of a public
12	duty or as authorized by law, the person intentionally:
13	(a) Trespasses on property for the purpose of subjecting
14	anyone to eavesdropping or other surveillance in a
15	private place;
16	(b) Peers or peeps into a window or other opening of a
17	dwelling or other structure adapted for sojourn or
18	overnight accommodations for the purpose of spying o
19	the occupant thereof or invading the privacy of
20	another person with a lewd or unlawful purpose, unde
21	circumstances in which a reasonable person in the



1		dwelling or other structure would not expect to be
2		observed;
3	(c)	Trespasses on property for the sexual gratification of
4		the actor;
5	(d)	Installs or uses, or both, in any private place,
6		without consent of the person or persons entitled to
7		privacy therein, any means or device for observing,
8		recording, amplifying, or broadcasting sounds or
9		events in that place other than another person in a
10		stage of undress or sexual activity;
11	(e)	Installs or uses outside a private place any device
12		for hearing, recording, amplifying, or broadcasting
13		sounds originating in that place which would not
14		ordinarily be audible or comprehensible outside,
15		without the consent of the person or persons entitled
16		to privacy therein;
17	(f)	Covertly records or broadcasts an image of another
18		person's intimate area underneath clothing, by use of
19		any device, and that image is taken while that person
20		is in a public place and without that person's
21		consent;

1	(g)	Intercepts, without the consent of the sender or
2		receiver, a message or photographic image by
3		telephone, telegraph, letter, electronic transmission,
4		or other means of communicating privately; but this
5		paragraph does not apply to:
6		(i) Overhearing of messages through a regularly
7		installed instrument on a telephone party line or
8		an extension; or
9		(ii) Interception by the telephone company, electronic
10		mail account provider, or telephone or electronic
11		mail subscriber incident to enforcement of
12		regulations limiting use of the facilities or
13		incident to other operation and use;
14	(h)	Divulges, without the consent of the sender or the
15		receiver, the existence or contents of any message or
16		photographic image by telephone, telegraph, letter,
17		electronic transmission, or other means of
18		communicating privately, if the accused knows that the
19		message or photographic image was unlawfully
20		intercepted or if the accused learned of the message

or photographic image in the course of employment with

an agency engaged in transmitting it; $[\Theta r]$

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1	(i)	Knowingly possesses materials created under
2		circumstances prohibited in section 711-1110.9 $[-]$; or
3	<u>(j)</u>	Uses a model aircraft or an unmanned aircraft system
4		operated for commercial or business purposes to
5		violate the provisions of this section or to track or
6		record a specific, identifiable person without that
7		person's consent."
8	2. I	By amending subsection (3) by adding three new
9	definition	ns to be appropriately inserted and to read as follows:
10	" <u>" Mo</u>	del aircraft" means an unmanned aircraft that is:
11	<u>(a)</u>	Capable of sustained flight in the atmosphere;
12	<u>(b)</u>	Flown within visual line of sight of the person
13		operating the aircraft; and
14	<u>(c)</u>	Flown for hobby or recreational purposes.
15	"Unm	anned aircraft" means an aircraft that is operated
16	without t	he possibility of direct human intervention from within
17	or on the	aircraft.
18	"Unm	anned aircraft system" means an unmanned aircraft and
19	associate	d elements, including communication links and
20	component	s that control the unmanned aircraft and are required
21	for the p	ilot in command to operate safely and efficiently in
22	the nation	nal airspace system."
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- 1 SECTION 5. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 6. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 5 3 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 6 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 7 the new sections in this Act.
- 8 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
