

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SIDEWALKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

| 1 | SECTION 1. Section 711-1105, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is |

| 2 | amended by amending subsections (1) and (2) to read as follows: |
| 3 | "(1) A person commits the offense of obstructing if, |
| 4 | whether alone or with others, and having no legal privilege to |
| 5 | do so, the person knowingly or recklessly [obstructs]: |
| 6 | (a) Obstructs any highway or public passage[, whether |
| 7 | alone or with others.]; or |
| 8 | (b) Provides less than one meter of space for passage on |
| 9 | any paved public sidewalk. |
| 10 | (2) A person in a gathering commits the offense of |
| 11 | obstructing if the person refuses to obey a reasonable request |
| 12 | or order by a law enforcement officer to move: |
| 13 | (a) To prevent [obstruction of a highway or other public |
| 14 | passage; or cease any activity prohibited under |
| 15 | subsection (1); or |
| 16 | (b) To maintain public safety by dispersing those gathered |
| 17 | in dangerous proximity to a public hazard." |

- 1 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
