The fee shall be paid each year together with all other taxes and fees levied by this chapter on a staggered basis as 11 established by each county as authorized by section 286-51, and **12** 13 the state registration for that county shall likewise be staggered so that the state registration fee is due and payable 14 15 at the same time and shall be collected together with the county fee. The state registration fee shall be deemed delinquent if 16 17 not paid with the county registration fee. The respective
