A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 103D-901, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding five new definitions to be appropriately
3	inserted and to read as follows:
4	""Service-connected disability" means a disability incurred
5	in the line of duty during active military, naval, or air
6	service as described in title 38 United States Code section
7	101(16).
8	"Service-disabled veteran" means a veteran who has been
9	found to have a service-connected disability determined by the
10	United States Department of Veterans Affairs or the United
11	States Department of Defense.
12	"Service-disabled veteran-owned small business" means a
13	<pre>small business:</pre>
14	(1) Where at least fifty-one per cent of the small
15	business is owned by one or more service-disabled
16	veterans living in the State, or in the case of a
17	corporation, at least fifty-one per cent of the stock

1		of the corporation is owned by one or more service-
2		disabled veterans living in the State;
3	(2)	Whose home office is located in the State; and
4	(3)	For which paragraphs (1) and (2) are factually
5		verified annually by the chief procurement officer.
6	<u>"Vete</u>	eran" means a person who has:
7	(1)	Been a member of the armed forces of the United States
8		or, while a citizen of the United States, was a member
9		of the armed forces of allies of the United States in
10		time of hostilities with a foreign country; and
11	(2)	Served under one or more of the following conditions:
12		(A) The veteran served a total of at least six
13		months;
14		(B) The veteran served for the duration of
15		hostilities regardless of the length of the
16		engagement;
17		(C) The veteran was discharged on the basis of
18		hardship; or
19		(D) The veteran was released from active duty because
20		of a service connected disability and was
21		discharged under honorable conditions.
22	"Vete	eran-owned small business" means a small business:

1	(1)	Where at least fifty-one per cent of the small
2		business is owned by one or more veterans living in
3		the State or, in the case of a corporation, at least
4		fifty-one per cent of the stock of the corporation is
5		owned by one or more veterans living in the State;
6	(2)	Whose home office is located in the State; and
7	<u>(3)</u>	For which paragraphs (1) and (2) are factually
8		verified annually by the chief procurement officer."
9	SECT	ION 2. Section 103D-903, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended t	o read as follows:
11	"§10	3D-903 Duties of the chief procurement officer. (a)
12	The chief	procurement officer may coordinate the implementation
13	of this p	art with any similar programs offered by the department
14	of busine	ss, economic development, and tourism or any other
15	governmen	tal body.
16	(b)	The chief procurement officer may provide staff to
17	provide s	ervice to designated state agencies to assist small
18	businesse	s in learning how to do business with the State.
19	(c)	In carrying out this part, the chief procurement
20	officer m	ay:
21	(1)	Give special publicity to procurement procedures and
22		issue special publications designed to assist small

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1		businesses in learning how to do business with the
2		State;
3	(2)	Compile, maintain, and make available source lists of
4		small businesses for the purpose of encouraging
5		procurement from small business;
6	(3)	Include small businesses on solicitation mailing
7		lists;
8	(4)	Develop and conduct training programs to assist small
9		businesses;
10	(5)	Reduce the level or change the types of bonding
11		normally required or accept alternative forms of
12		security;
13	(6)	Make special provisions for progress payments;
14	(7)	Establish the goal that twenty per cent of the State's
15		annual purchasing expenditure be awarded to small
16		business; provided that a combined total of not less
17		than three per cent of the twenty per cent set aside
18		by this paragraph shall be awarded to veteran-owned
19		and service-disabled veteran-owned small businesses;
20		and
21	(8)	Impose mandatory evaluation criteria designed to
22		encourage the use of small business as subcontractors

1	on large contracts not susceptible to performance by
2	small business.
3	Nothing in this section shall limit, restrict, or preclude a
4	veteran-owned small business or service-disabled veteran-owned
5	small business from qualifying for any other preferences, set-
6	asides, or criteria that may apply under section 103D-906, or
7	any other provision of this chapter, and this section shall
8	operate as a further preference when a veteran-owned small
9	business or service-disabled veteran-owned small business
10	qualifies for more than one such preference."
11	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
12	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Report Title:

Hawaii Public Procurement Code; Veteran-Owned and Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Businesses; Set Aside

Description:

Requires that at least three per cent of the twenty per cent set—aside for small businesses shall be awarded to veteran—owned and service—disabled veteran—owned small businesses. Stipulates that this preference is in addition to any other preferences provided under the procurement code. Effective July 1, 2050. (HB166 HD1)
