BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

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1 [(f)] (e) For purposes of this section, "student 2 instructional hours" [means student learning time during which students are engaged in learning activities including regularly 3 4 scheduled instruction and learning assessments within the 5 curriculum, and does not include lunch, recess, or passing 6 time.] shall be defined by the board. 7 $[\frac{g}{g}]$ (f) The department of education, with the board of 8 education and office of the governor, and in consultation with 9 representatives of the affected collective bargaining units, 10 shall submit to the legislature no later than twenty days prior 11 to the convening of the regular sessions of 2013, 2014, and 12 2015, [2016, 2017, and 2018,] a report on its progress and 13 efforts to meet the requirements of subsections (a), (b), and 14 (c) [, and (d)]." 15 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. **17** SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030.

Report Title:

Department of Education; Student Instructional Hours

Description:

Requires all public secondary schools to implement a school year that includes nine hundred ninety student instructional hours beginning with the 2014-2015 school year. Repeals the requirement that by the 2016-2018 school years, all public schools implement a school year of one hundred eighty days, including one thousand eighty student instructional hours for both elementary and secondary school grades. Allows board of education to define "student instructional hours." Effective July 1, 2030. (HB1675 HD1)

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
