

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. According to the United States Census Bureau
- 2 and the department of business, economic development, and
- 3 tourism statistics, nearly forty per cent of private residences
- 4 on Oahu were built in 1969 or earlier. In certain census
- 5 tracts, this number is as high as eighty-five per cent.
- 6 Hawaii law provides that any building, structure, object,
- 7 district, area, or site over fifty years old is considered
- 8 historic property. Further, current application of historic
- 9 preservation law requires review by the state historic
- 10 preservation division of the department of land and natural
- 11 resources prior to the granting of permits for proposed projects
- 12 on historic properties. This requirement, in certain instances,
- 13 has delayed the granting of permits for a period of many months,
- 14 which has had a negative impact on the construction industry.
- 15 As nearly forty per cent of residential properties on Oahu have
- 16 reached or are approaching fifty years of age, it is prudent for
- 17 the State to reexamine the current processes and procedures
- 18 regarding historic properties.



# H.B. NO. 1678

1	The purpose of this Act is to provide that.
2	(1) Historic properties shall be over seventy-five years
3	old; and
4	(2) Nothing in chapter 6E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall
5	be construed to require the department of land and
6	natural resources to review a proposed project that
7	may affect a residential property that has not been
8	entered, or nominated by the owner of the residence
9	for entry, onto the Hawaii register of historic
10	places.
11	SECTION 2. Section 6E-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended by amending the definition of "historic property" to
13	read as follows:
14	""Historic property" means any building, structure, object
15	district, area, or site, including heiau and underwater site,
16	[which] that is over [fifty] seventy-five years old."
17	SECTION 3. Section 6E-42, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
18	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
19	"(a) Before any agency or officer of the State or its
20	political subdivisions approves any project involving a permit,
21	license, certificate, land use change, subdivision, or other
22	entitlement for use[, which] that may affect historic property,

- 1 aviation artifacts, or a burial site, the agency or office shall
- 2 advise the department and prior to any approval allow the
- 3 department an opportunity for review and comment on the effect
- 4 of the proposed project on historic properties, aviation
- 5 artifacts, or burial sites, consistent with section 6E-43,
- 6 including those listed in the Hawaii register of historic
- 7 places[-]; provided that nothing in this chapter shall be
- 8 construed to require a review by the department for a project on
- 9 residential property that has not been entered, or nominated by
- 10 the owner of the residence for entry, onto the Hawaii register
- 11 of historic places. For the purposes of this subsection,
- 12 "residential property" means real property that is used or
- 13 occupied as a place of residence for one or more persons."
- 14 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

## H.B. NO. 1678

### Report Title:

DLNR; Historic Preservation; Review; Residential Property

#### Description:

Provides that historic properties shall be over seventy-five years old. Provides that nothing in chapter 6E, HRS, shall be construed to require a review by the DLNR for residential property that has not been entered, or nominated by the owner of the residence for entry, onto the Hawaii register of historic places.
