A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that residents of the
- 2 island of Hawaii would greatly benefit from the addition of two
- 3 advanced life support ambulances to augment the Hawaii county
- 4 emergency medical services system for residents of the Puna and
- 5 Makalei areas. The populations of these areas have
- 6 significantly increased over the years, which has corresponded
- 7 with a steady increase in calls for emergency medical services.
- 8 The legislature further finds that access to primary health
- 9 care in Puna and Makalei is challenging for the communities.
- 10 For many residents, primary care services are as many as thirty
- 11 miles away. Coupled with economic and transportation
- 12 challenges, emergency medical services have become the access
- 13 point for health care to many residents.
- 14 Due to the lack of resources, it has become common for
- 15 medics to have up to ten transports in a twenty-four hour shift.
- 16 The potential for fatigue resulting in errors in judgment,
- 17 driving, and overall safety are of great concern for personnel
- 18 and residents.

1	The legislature further finds that new advanced life
2	support ambulances will help reduce death and disability among
3	residents and visitors on the island of Hawaii. A timely
4	response to a 911 call is critical to increase the likelihood of
5	successful outcomes for injured or sick individuals. Given the
6	island's significant growth and aging population, two advanced
7	life support ambulances are needed and will be cost-effective.
8	The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for two
9	advanced life support ambulances to be based in the Puna and
10	Makalei areas on the island of Hawaii and to be used during
11	daily peak hours from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., including the
12	acquisition of vehicles, equipment, and personnel costs for
13	state-certified emergency medical service personnel.
14	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
15	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
16	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for two
17	advanced life support ambulances to be:
18	(1) Based in Puna and Makalei on the island of Hawaii; and
19	(2) Used during daily peak hours from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00
20	p.m.,

- 1 and to include the acquisition of vehicles, equipment, and
- 2 personnel costs for state-certified emergency medical service
- 3 personnel.
- 4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 5 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2015.
