A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State of Hawaii
2	is vulnerable to a wide range of natural and manmade hazards,
3	which threaten the life, health, and safety of its people;
4	damage and destroy property; disrupt services, everyday
5	business, and recreational activities; and impede economic
6	development.
7	Growth in the State's population - especially in the
8	numbers of businesses and persons residing in coastal areas, in
9	the elderly population, in the number of seasonal vacationers,
10	and in the number of persons with functional and access needs -
11	has greatly complicated the State's ability to coordinate its
12	emergency management resources and activities.
13	The purpose of this Act is to support the State of Hawaii
14	in its efforts to plan for, respond to, and recover from
15	disasters and emergencies by:

1		to develop recommendations on creating the Hawaii
2		disaster resilience plan; and
3	(2)	Requiring the legislative reference bureau to prepare
4		the Hawaii disaster resilience plan by incorporating
5		recommendations of the Hawaii disaster resilience task
6		force with the goal of defining and implementing state
7		goals, objectives, policies, and priority guidelines.
8	SECT	ION 2. (a) There is established a Hawaii disaster
9	resilienc	e task force to review current disaster management
10	coordinat	ion and other functional components of disaster
11	planning.	
12	(b)	The task force shall consist of twenty-five members as
13	follows:	
14	(1)	Three members from the house of representatives who
15		shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of
16		representatives;
17	(2)	Three members from the senate who shall be appointed
18		by the senate president;
19	(3)	The adjutant general or the adjutant general's
20		designee;
21	(4)	The chairperson of the public utilities commission or
22		the chairperson's designee;

•	(3)	the director of the office of planning of the
2		director's designee;
3	(6)	The chairperson of the Hawaii tourism authority board
4		of directors or the chairperson's designee;
5	(7)	The director of the legislative reference bureau or
6		the director's designee;
7	(8)	The executive director of the national disaster
8		preparedness training center at the University of
9		Hawaii or the executive director's designee;
10	(9)	One member from the department of urban and regional
11		planning at the University of Hawaii who shall be
12		appointed by the president of the University of
13		Hawaii; and
14	(10)	Three members each from the county of Hawaii, city and
15		county of Honolulu, county of Kauai, and county of
16		Maui, consisting for each county of the departmental
17		director of the appropriate county planning department
18		or agency or the director's designee; the departmental
19		director of the appropriate county emergency
20		management department or agency or the director's
21		designee; and one member appointed by the mayor.

- 1 (c) The task force shall select one of its members to
- 2 serve as the chairperson.
- 3 (d) The members of the task force shall receive
- 4 reimbursement for expenses, including travel expenses, that are
- 5 necessary for the performance of their duties. No task force
- 6 member shall be made subject to chapter 84, Hawaii Revised
- 7 Statutes, solely because of that member's participation as a
- 8 member of the task force.
- 9 (e) The office of planning shall assist the task force in
- 10 performing its duties as required under this Act. In carrying
- 11 out its duties under this Act, the task force may also request
- 12 staff assistance from the department of budget and finance;
- 13 department of business, economic development, and tourism;
- 14 department of transportation; department of land and natural
- 15 resources; and other appropriate state and county agencies.
- 16 (f) The task force shall review, solicit input on, and
- 17 develop recommendations for the creation of the Hawaii disaster
- 18 resilience plan to ensure its relevance as a guide for future
- 19 long-term disaster planning. The task force shall, among other
- 20 things:

1	(1)	Determine if existing disaster management criteria for
2		allocating resources and addressing coordination
3		between federal, state, and counties are adequate;
4	(2)	Determine if existing disaster management facilities
5		associated with emergency response, public safety
6		regeneration, and civic restoration are adequate;
7	(3)	Research the implementation of a structured, systemic,
8		and timely outreach disaster management program
9		targeting public, private, and nonprofit stakeholders;
10	(4)	Identify and list the capabilities and weaknesses of
11		the State and counties in resilience planning;
12	(5)	Develop criteria that addresses disaster resilience
13		needs within the State;
14	(6)	Determine the impact of a disaster in the State and
15		estimate the time required to restore functions within
16		the State if the disaster were to strike under current
17		conditions;
18	(7)	Research and record the best practices of disaster
19		preparedness and resilience from other states and
20		other national and international sources;

1	(8) Define acceptable timeframes to restore all statewide
2	functions after a disaster to fulfill expected
3	resilient performance; and
4	(9) Recommend changes in practice and policies that, if
5	implemented during the next fifty years, will allow
6	Hawaii to reach the desired resilience targets.
7	The task force shall develop criteria and benchmarks to
8	measure compliance with task force recommendations that have
9	been enacted into law or adopted as policies by governmental
10	agencies, and to guide budgetary priorities.
11	SECTION 3. The task force shall submit a report of its
12	findings, program recommendations, and proposed legislation, if
13	any, to the legislature and to the legislative reference bureau
14	no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
15	session of 2015.
16	SECTION 4. Upon receipt of the task force's report, the
17	legislative reference bureau shall prepare the Hawaii disaster
. 18	resilience plan, which shall define and implement state goals,
19	objectives, policies, and priority guidelines in the State's
20	efforts to plan for, respond to, and recover from disasters and
21	emergencies.

- 1 The legislative reference bureau, in preparing the plan,
- 2 shall seek input from all state departments, solicit public
- 3 views and concerns, and incorporate all or a portion of the
- 4 recommendations reported by the Hawaii disaster resilience task
- 5 force. The plan shall serve as a guideline for funding and
- 6 implementation by state and county agencies. The office of
- 7 planning shall assist the legislative reference bureau in
- 8 reviewing the plan.
- 9 SECTION 5. The legislative reference bureau shall submit
- 10 the Hawaii disaster resilience plan to the legislature no later
- 11 than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session
- **12** of 2016.
- 13 SECTION 6. The legislative reference bureau, with
- 14 cooperation from the office of planning, shall update the Hawaii
- 15 disaster resilience plan in 2017 and report to the legislature.
- 16 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
- 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$25,000 or so much
- 18 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for the
- 19 review, recommendations, and community planning to be performed
- 20 by the Hawaii disaster resilience task force.
- 21 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the legislative
- 22 reference bureau for the purposes of this Act.



- 1 SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$100,000 or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for
- 4 creating the Hawaii disaster resilience plan.
- 5 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the legislative
- 6 reference bureau for the purposes of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 9. The Hawaii disaster resilience task force shall
- 8 terminate on June 30, 2017.
- 9 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
