A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LANGUAGE ACCESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. In 2013, the legislature passed H.B. No. 266,

 C.D. 1, enacted as Act 217, Session Laws of Hawaii 2013, which
- 3 further strengthened implementation of the State's language
- 4 access laws. The Act created a statewide language access
- 5 resource center under the office of language access to serve as
- 6 a centralized resource to meet the specific needs of government
- 7 agencies and state-funded entities to comply with the State's
- 8 language access laws and to benefit the general public.
- 9 Among its other functions, the statewide language access
- 10 resource center must maintain a publicly-available roster of
- 11 language interpreters and translators, train state and state-
- 12 funded agencies on how to effectively obtain and use the
- 13 services of language interpreters and translators, and support
- 14 the recruitment and retention of language interpreters and
- 15 translators who provide services to these agencies. Act 217,
- 16 Session Laws of Hawaii 2013, also requires the executive
- 17 director of the office of language access, in consultation with
- 18 the office of information management and technology, to develop



- 1 a multilingual website pilot project. The legislature finds
- 2 that continued and appropriate funding of the statewide language
- 3 access resource center and the multilingual website pilot
- 4 project is essential to their effective implementation and
- 5 provision of services to the general public.
- 6 The purpose of this Act is to amend the appropriation
- 7 amounts for fiscal year 2014-2015 contained in Act 217, Session
- 8 Laws of Hawaii 2013, for the establishment of the statewide
- 9 language access resource center and the establishment of the
- 10 multilingual website pilot project.
- 11 SECTION 2. Act 217, Session Laws of Hawaii 2013, is
- 12 amended by amending sections 6 and 7 to read as follows:
- 13 "SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
- 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$170,000 or so much
- 15 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and the
- 16 [same] sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary
- 17 for fiscal year 2014-2015 to establish a statewide language
- 18 access resource center within the office of language access to
- 19 allow state agencies and covered entities to provide
- 20 interpretation and translation services to limited English
- 21 proficient individuals in accordance with Hawaii's language
- 22 access laws.

- 1 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 2 of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$80,000 or so much
- 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and the
- 6 [same] sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary
- 7 for fiscal year 2014-2015 to establish a multilingual website
- 8 pilot project to enable limited English proficient individuals
- 9 to obtain information about government services in their own
- 10 language.
- 11 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 12 of health for the purposes of this Act."
- 13 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
