A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the University of
2	Hawaii at Manoa's McNair student achievement program provides
3	students with an intensive, faculty-mentored internship and
4	education program designed to prepare students for graduate
5	school. Participants in the program receive personalized
6	faculty mentoring and other academic services in a culturally
7	and socially supportive environment. As participants immerse
8	themselves in research and other scholarly projects, college
9	becomes not only a path to a graduate or doctoral degree but a
10	stepping stone to making a vital contribution to their
11	communities.

- The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to support
- 13 the University of Hawaii at Manoa's McNair student achievement
- 14 program and establish two full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE)
- 15 positions to oversee and administer the program.
- 16 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000 or so much
- 18 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 to support



- 1 the University of Hawaii at Manoa's McNair student achievement
- 2 program and to establish two full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE)
- 3 positions within the University of Hawaii at Manoa to oversee
- 4 and administer the program.
- 5 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 6 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
