H.B. NO. 1746

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 51, Session Laws 2 of Hawaii 2004 (Act 51), sought to revamp education in Hawaii 3 by, in part, creating an interagency working group to develop plans for transferring certain rights, powers, functions, 4 duties, and resources from various state departments to the 5 6 department of education. The interagency working group ceased to exist on June 30, 2007. 7 The legislature further finds that re-establishing 8 interagency working groups will help address various issues that 9 10 have either not been fully resolved since Act 51 or have arisen as a result of the transferring of certain rights, powers, 11 functions, duties, and resources from various state departments

12 functions, duties, and resources from various state departments13 to the department of education.

14 The purpose of this Act is to re-establish interagency15 working groups based on Act 51.
