A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 200, Session
2	Laws of Hawaii 2012, established a joint legislative task force
3	to explore the possibility of implementing a medicaid buy-in
4	program for individuals with disabilities, who are either not
5	working or are currently working and would like to earn more
6	income, based upon Hawaii's current medicaid income and asset
7	limits and subject to approval of the federal Centers for
8	Medicare and Medicaid Services. The legislature notes that a
9	significant portion of the population in Hawaii receives federal
10	or state benefits because of disabling conditions. Moreover,
11	current state programs and policies, including state-designed
12	medicaid waiver programs, create disincentives for persons with
13	disabilities to become employed, maintain employment, or
14	increase their employment income.
15	The legislature also finds that from 2005 through 2012,
16	Hawaii was the recipient of a grant from the federal Centers for

Medicare and Medicaid Services for the development of a medicaid

infrastructure program to design and implement a medicaid buy-in

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- 1 program for individuals with disabilities who are employed or
- 2 desire to become employed and purchase medicaid coverage
- 3 authorized under the Ticket to Work and Work Incentives
- 4 Improvement Act of 1999 (P.L. 106-170). Prior to 1999, other
- 5 potential federal options for the creation of a medicaid buy-in
- 6 program included the 1997 Balanced Budget Act and a waiver
- 7 pursuant to title 32 United States Code section 1115, the Social
- 8 Security Act.
- 9 The legislature further finds that it is advantageous for
- 10 economic development in the State and in the best interests of
- 11 Hawaii's citizens with disabilities to establish programs and
- 12 policies that encourage employment. It is the intent of the
- 13 legislature that all state agencies work with citizens to
- 14 identify and remove barriers to employment for persons with
- 15 disabilities. Adults with disabilities need adequate health
- 16 insurance, but options for insurance coverage are limited, even
- 17 with the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act.
- 18 The purpose of this Act is to encourage individuals to gain
- 19 employment and improve their employment opportunities by
- 20 establishing a medicaid buy-in program for individuals with
- 21 disabilities.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: 4 "§346- Medicaid buy-in program for workers with 5 disabilities. (a) There is established within the department 6 of human services the medicaid buy-in program for workers with 7 disabilities. The purpose of the medicaid buy-in program for workers with disabilities is to support employment of 8 9 individuals with disabilities by expanding their access to 10 medicaid. 11 (b) To qualify for the medical buy-in program for workers 12 with disabilities, a person shall: 13 (1) Be a resident of the State; 14 (2) Be at least eighteen years of age; 15 (3) Meet medicaid citizenship requirements; **16** (4)Have a disability, as defined by the Social Security 17 Administration; 18 (5) Be gainfully employed, including part-time or full-19 time work; provided that all earnings shall be 20 reported to the department of labor and industrial 21 relations;

1	<u>(6)</u>	Have income that does not exceed three hundred per	
2		cent of the federal poverty level; and	
3	<u>(7)</u>	Have assets that do not exceed an amount established	
4		by the department, provided that the limitation shall	
5		not be less than \$25,000.	
6	<u>(c)</u>	The medicaid buy-in program may have an enrollment	
7	limit as	determined by the department, provided that the	
8	limitatio	n shall not be less than two hundred individuals.	
9	(d)	The department may require a person participating in	
10	the medic	aid buy-in program for workers with disabilities to pay	
11	a premium or other cost-sharing charges as determined by the		
12	departmen	t.	
13	<u>(e)</u>	The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter	
14	91 necess	ary for the purposes of this section."	
15	SECT	ION 3. The department of human services shall	
16	implement	the medicaid buy-in program for workers with	
17	disabilit	ies no later than July 1, 2017.	
18	SECT	TON 4. The department of human services shall submit a	
19	report to	the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the	
20	convening	of the regular session of 2016, detailing its progress	
21	in implem	enting the medicaid buy-in program for workers with	
22	disabilit	ies. The report shall include the department's	
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- 1 findings, recommendations, and any proposed legislation, and
- 2 shall specify resources needed to implement the medicaid buy-in
- 3 program for workers with disabilities.
- 4 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$165,000 or so much
- 6 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for the
- 7 University of Hawaii center on disability studies to prepare and
- 8 conduct outreach and training programs relating to the medicaid
- 9 buy-in program for workers with disabilities.
- 10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 11 Hawaii center on disability studies for the purposes of this
- 12 Act.
- 13 SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
