## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

	DE IT MINICIPALITA PRODUCTIONE OF THE STATE OF THE WAIT.
1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 200, Session
2	Laws of Hawaii 2012, established a joint legislative task force
3	to explore the possibility of implementing a medicaid buy-in
4	program for working individuals with disabilities based upon
5	Hawaii's current medicaid income and asset limits and subject to
6	approval of the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid
7	Services. The legislature notes that a significant portion of
8	the population in Hawaii receives federal or state benefits for
9	disabling conditions. Moreover, current state programs and
10	policies, including state-designed medicaid waiver programs,
11	create disincentives for persons with disabilities to become
12	employed, maintain employment, or increase their employment
13	income.
14	The legislature also finds that from 2005 through 2012,
15	Hawaii was the recipient of a grant from the federal Centers for
16	Medicare and Medicaid Services for the development of a medicaid
17	infrastructure program to design and implement a medicaid buy-in

program for individuals with disabilities who are employed or

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- 1 desire to become employed and purchase medicaid coverage
- 2 authorized under the Ticket to Work and Work Incentives
- 3 Improvement Act of 1999 (P.L. 106-170). Prior to 1999, other
- 4 potential federal options for the creation of a medicaid buy-in
- 5 program included the 1997 Balanced Budget Act and a waiver
- 6 pursuant to title 42 United States Code section 1115, the Social
- 7 Security Act.
- 8 The legislature further finds that it is advantageous for
- 9 economic development in the State and in the best interests of
- 10 Hawaii's citizens with disabilities to establish programs and
- 11 policies that encourage employment. It is the intent of the
- 12 legislature that all state agencies work with citizens to
- 13 identify and remove barriers to employment for persons with
- 14 disabilities. Adults with disabilities need adequate health
- 15 insurance, but options for insurance coverage are limited, even
- 16 with the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act.
- 17 The purpose of this Act is to encourage individuals to gain
- 18 employment and improve their employment opportunities by
- 19 establishing a medicaid buy-in program and medicaid buy-in pilot
- 20 program for workers with disabilities.

1	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to re	ad as follows:		
4	" <u>§34</u>	6- Medicaid buy-in program for workers with		
5	disabilit	ies. (a) There is established within the department		
6	the medic	aid buy-in program for workers with disabilities. The		
7	purpose o	f the medicaid buy-in program for workers with		
8	disabilit	ies is to support the employment of individuals with		
9	disabilit	ies by expanding their access to medicaid.		
10	(b)	To qualify for the medicaid buy-in program for workers		
11	with disa	bilities, a person shall:		
12	(1)	Be a resident of the State;		
13	(2)	Be at least eighteen years of age;		
14	(3)	Meet medicaid citizenship requirements;		
15	(4)	Have a disability, as defined by the Social Security		
16		Administration;		
17	(5)	Be gainfully employed, including part-time or full-		
18		time work; provided that all earnings shall be		
19		reported to the department of labor and industrial		
20		relations;		
21	(6)	Have income that does not exceed three hundred per		
22		cent of the federal poverty level; and		
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1	(7) Have assets that do not exceed an amount established
2	by the department, provided that the limitation shall
3	not be less than \$25,000.
4	(c) The medicaid buy-in program may have an enrollment
5	limit as determined by the department, provided that the
6	limitation shall not be less than two hundred individuals.
7	(d) The department may require a person participating in
8	the medicaid buy-in program for workers with disabilities to pay
9	a premium or other cost-sharing charges as determined by the
10	department.
11	(e) The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
12	91 necessary for the purposes of this section."
13	SECTION 3. The department of human services shall
14	implement the medicaid buy-in program for workers with
15	disabilities no later than July 1, 2017.
16	SECTION 4. The department of health shall establish a
17	medicaid buy-in pilot program for workers with disabilities to
18	support the employment of individuals with disabilities by
19	expanding their access to medicaid. The pilot program shall
20	serve one hundred workers with disabilities who obtain
21	employment and, as a result of their employment, are no longer
22	eligible for medicaid.

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- 1 The department of health shall adopt rules as necessary to
- 2 implement and administer the pilot program.
- 3 The department of health shall implement the medicaid buy-
- 4 in pilot program for workers with disabilities no later than
- 5 July 1, 2015. The pilot program shall terminate on June 30,
- **6** 2017.
- 7 SECTION 5. The department of human services shall submit a
- 8 report to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the
- 9 convening of the regular session of 2016, detailing its progress
- 10 in implementing the medicaid buy-in program for workers with
- 11 disabilities pursuant to section 2 of this Act. The report
- 12 shall include the department's findings, recommendations, and
- 13 any proposed legislation, and shall specify resources needed to
- 14 implement the medicaid buy-in program for workers with
- 15 disabilities. The department of human services, with the
- 16 assistance of the department of health, shall include in the
- 17 report an update on the medicaid buy-in pilot program.
- 18 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
- 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$400,000 or so much
- 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for the
- 21 medicaid buy-in pilot program for workers with disabilities who

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- 1 are no longer eligible for medicaid benefits because they
- 2 obtained employment.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 health for the purposes of this section.
- 5 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 7 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for
- 8 the University of Hawaii center on disability studies to prepare
- 9 and conduct outreach and training programs relating to the
- 10 medicaid buy-in program for workers with disabilities.
- 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
- 12 Hawaii center on disability studies for the purposes of this
- 13 section.
- 14 SECTION 8. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030.
