## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VETERANS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTI	ON 1. Section 286-109, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
3	"(a)	Upon payment of the required fee and upon
4	demonstrat	ing the ability to operate a certain category or
5	categories	s of motor vehicles to the satisfaction of the examiner
6	of drivers, an applicant for a driver's license shall be issued	
7	a single 1	icense of a design approved by the director of
8	transportation upon which is made a notation of:	
9	(1)	The category or categories of motor vehicles the
10		applicant may operate;
11	(2)	Any restrictive provisions to which the license is
12		subject; [and]
13	<u>(3)</u>	Veteran status, if desired by the applicant; provided
14		that the notation shall be on the front of the license
15		and shall not include any designation other than the
16		term "veteran"; and
17	[ <del>(3)</del> ]	(4) When the license is issued to a person under
18		twenty-one years of age, a statement, in clearly
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1	legible print that shall contrast with the other		
2	information appearing on the license, which indicates		
3	the date on which the person will attain the age of		
4	twenty-one years.		
5	As used in this subsection, "veteran" means any person who		
6	served in any of the uniformed services of the United States and		
7	was discharged under conditions other than dishonorable."		
8	SECTION 2. Section 286-111, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
9	amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:		
10	"(d) Every application shall state the full name, date of		
11	birth, sex, occupation, veteran status if applicable and desired		
12	by the applicant, social security number if the applicant is		
13	eligible for a social security number, the residence address,		
14	and business address, if any, of the applicant, shall briefly		
15	describe the applicant, and shall state whether the applicant		
16	has theretofore been licensed as a driver, and, if so, when and		
17	in what state or country, and whether any such license has ever		
18	been suspended or revoked, or whether an application has ever		
19	been refused, and if so, the date of and reason for the		
20	suspension, revocation, or refusal."		
21	SECTION 3. Section 286-303, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
22	amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:		

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1	"(C)	Every application for an identification card or
2	duplicate	of an identification card shall be made on a form
3	developed	by the director and furnished by the examiner of
4	drivers, s	signed by the applicant, and signed by the applicant's
5	parent or	guardian if the applicant is under eighteen years of
6	age. The	application shall contain the following information:
7	(1)	Name and complete address, including the number and
8		street name, of the applicant's permanent residence;
9	(2)	The applicant's occupation and any pertinent data
10		relating thereto;
11	(3)	The applicant's citizenship status;
12	(4)	The applicant's veteran status if applicable and
13		desired by the applicant;
14	[ <del>-(4)-</del> ]	(5) The applicant's date and place of birth;
15	[ <del>(5)</del> ]	(6) General description of the applicant, including
16		the applicant's gender, height, weight, hair color,
17		and eye color;
18	[ <del>-(6)-</del> ]	(7) The applicant's left and right index fingerprints
19		or, if clear impressions cannot be obtained, other
20		identifying imprints as specified by rules of the
21		director;
22	[ <del>(7)</del> ]	(8) The social security number of the applicant; and

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- 1 [<del>(8)</del>] <u>(9)</u> A digitized frontal photograph of the applicant's
- **2** full face.
- 3 Each applicant shall present documentary evidence as required by
- 4 the examiner of drivers of the applicant's age and identity, and
- 5 the applicant shall swear or affirm that all information given
- 6 is true and correct."
- 7 SECTION 4. Section 286-305, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
- 9 "(b) The examiner of drivers, after obtaining the
- 10 fingerprint of the applicant as provided in this part and after
- 11 obtaining the information required by or pursuant to this part,
- 12 shall issue to each applicant an identification card in a form
- 13 and with identifying information that the director deems
- 14 necessary and appropriate[-], including a notation of veteran
- 15 status, if desired by the applicant, on the front of the card
- 16 where applicable; provided that such notation shall not include
- 17 any designation other than the term "veteran". As used in this
- 18 subsection, "veteran" means any person who served in any of the
- 19 uniformed services of the United States and was discharged under
- 20 conditions other than dishonorable."
- 21 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 22 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

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1 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on October 1, 2014.
