A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Section 302A-1159, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

 "\$302A-1159 Physical examination required. No child shall
- 4 [be admitted to] attend any school for the first time in the
- 5 State unless the child presents to the appropriate school
- 6 official a report from a licensed physician or advanced practice
- 7 registered nurse of the results of a physical examination
- 8 performed within a year of the date of [entry into] attendance
- 9 at school. A child may [enter] attend school provisionally upon
- 10 submitting written documentation from a licensed physician,
- 11 advanced practice registered nurse, or other authorized
- 12 representative of the department of health stating that the
- 13 child is in the process of undergoing a physical examination.
- 14 Further documentation showing that the required physical
- 15 examination has been completed shall be submitted to the
- 16 appropriate school official no later than three months after the
- 17 child first [entered] attended the school."

- 1 SECTION 2. (a) The board of education shall establish a
- 2 pilot program in one complex area of the board's choosing, under
- 3 which no child shall attend kindergarten, sixth grade, or ninth
- 4 grade unless the child presents to the appropriate school
- 5 official a report from a licensed physician or advanced practice
- 6 registered nurse of the results of a physical examination
- 7 performed within six months of the date of attendance.
- 8 (b) The board of education shall allow a child to attend
- 9 school provisionally upon submitting written documentation from
- 10 a licensed physician, advanced practice registered nurse, or
- 11 other authorized representative of the department of health
- 12 stating that the child is in the process of undergoing a
- 13 physical examination required by this subsection. If a child is
- 14 permitted to attend school provisionally, the board of education
- 15 shall require that further documentation showing that the
- 16 required physical examination has been completed be submitted to
- 17 the appropriate school official no later than three months after
- 18 the date of attendance.
- 19 (c) The pilot program shall begin with the 2015-2016
- 20 school year.
- 21 (d) The board of education shall submit a report of its
- 22 findings, recommendations, and proposed legislation, if any, to

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- 1 the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening
- 2 of the regular session of 2016.
- 3 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 5 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 to
- 6 the department of education to carry out the purposes of this
- 7 Act.
- 8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 9 education for the purposes of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 13 provided that section 3 shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
