A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 302A-1164, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended as follows:		
3	1.	By amending subsections (a) and (b) to read:	
4	"(a)	The department shall permit:	
5	(1)	The self-administration of medication by a student for	
6		asthma, anaphylaxis, or other potentially	
7		life-threatening illnesses; and	
8	(2)	Department employees and agents to volunteer to	
9		administer glucagon in an emergency situation to	
10		students with diabetes[-] or administer auto-	
11		injectable epinephrine to students in anaphylactic	
12		shock.	
13	(b)	The student's parent or guardian shall provide the	
14	department with:		
15	(1)	Written authorization for the self-administration of	
16		medication or the emergency administration of	
17		glucagon[+] or auto-injectable epinephrine;

1	(2)	In the case of self-administration of medication,
2		written certification from the student's physician or
3		physician assistant stating that the student:
4		(A) Has asthma, anaphylaxis, or another potentially
5		life-threatening illness; and
6		(B) Is capable of, and has been instructed in, the

8		medication; and
9	(3)	In the case of emergency administration of glucagon to
10		a student with diabetes[7] or epinephrine to a student
11		in anaphylactic shock, written certification from the
12		student's physician or physician assistant stating
13		that the student has medical orders that glucagon or
14		epinephrine may be administered by a volunteer."
15	2.	By amending subsection (g) to read:
16	" (g)	[Any] The department of health shall provide proper
17	instructi	on and training to every employee or agent who
18	volunteers to administer glucagon in an emergency situation to a	
19	student with diabetes [shall receive instruction in the proper	
20	administration of glucagon by a qualified health care	
21	professio	nal. A "qualified-health-care professional" means a
22	licensed 	physician, physician assistant, advanced practice
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- 1 registered nurse or registered nurse, or certified diabetes
- 2 educator.] or to administer epinephrine to a student in
- 3 anaphylactic shock. The student's parent or guardian shall
- 4 supply the school with the glucagon kit required to administer
- 5 the glucagon[-] or with injectable epinephrine supplies to
- 6 administer epinephrine. The school shall store the glucagon kit
- 7 or epinephrine kit in a secure but accessible location."
- 8 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 10 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for
- 11 the department of education to contract with the department of
- 12 health for instruction, training, and related expenses required
- 13 for compliance with this Act.
- 14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 15 education for the purposes of this Act.
- 16 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 18 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 19 provided that section 2 shall take effect on July 1, 2014.

Report Title:

Education; Administration of Epinephrine; Department of Health; Appropriation

Description:

Allows department of education employees and agents to volunteer to administer epinephrine to a student in anaphylactic shock. Requires the department of health to provide proper instruction and training to every employee or agent who volunteers to administer glucagon and epinephrine. Requires a student's parent or guardian to provide the department of education with written authorization for auto-injectable epinephrine and to supply injectable epinephrine supplies to administer the epinephrine. Makes an appropriation for required instruction, training, and related expenses.
