BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 302A-1164, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

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A "qualified health care professional" means a licensed 1 2 physician, physician assistant, advanced practice registered 3 nurse or registered nurse, or certified diabetes educator. The 4 student's parent or quardian shall supply the school with the 5 glucagon kit required to administer the glucagon [-,] or with 6 injectable epinephrine supplies to administer epinephrine. The 7 school shall store the glucagon kit or epinephrine kit in a 8 secure but accessible location. The department may also make 9 arrangements to receive injectable epinephrine supplies from 10 injectable epinephrine manufacturers or suppliers." 11 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 13 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for the department of education to contract for instruction, training, 14 15 and related expenses required for compliance with this Act. 16 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 17 education for the purposes of this Act.

18 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

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SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.



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Report Title: Education; Administration of Epinephrine; Appropriation

Description:

Authorizes Department of Education employees and agents with specified training to volunteer to administer epinephrine to a student with anaphylaxis. Allows the Department of Education to make arrangements to receive injectable epinephrine supplies from manufacturers and suppliers. Effective July 1, 2050. (HB1777 HD2)
