## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE WRAPAROUND SERVICES PROGRAM.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that at-risk youths, or 2 minors who are subject to abuse, neglect, or are predisposed to
- 3 develop an addiction or other psychiatric disorder, require a
- 4 comprehensive system of care that is primarily focused on the
- 5 provision of behavioral and psychiatric health services. The
- 6 legislature further finds that the functionality of any system
- 7 of this nature must be both efficient and cost-effective, and is
- $oldsymbol{8}$  contingent upon interagency communication.
- 9 The Wraparound Services program (WRAP) is a comprehensive
- 10 system of care that provides individualized services for at-risk
- 11 youth. Last year, the department of human services launched
- 12 WRAP to target 10 youth at high risk for hospitalization or of
- 13 being relocated to out-of-state specialized programs. To date,
- 14 none of the youths have been hospitalized or moved out of state
- 15 (department of human services testimony on the FY 2015
- 16 supplemental budget, January 13, 2014).
- 17 It is the intent of this measure to fund research through

- 1 WRAP that will explore methods of blended funding between
- 2 departments and participating programs, to evaluate and measure
- 3 outcomes, and to provide training for service providers.
- 4 The purpose of this Act is to provide continued funding for
- 5 the Wraparound Services program.
- 6 SECTION 2. (a) There is already established within the
- 7 department of human services a Wraparound Services program. The
- 8 department shall continue to serve as the responsible agency for
- 9 WRAP, and shall represent the multiagency collaboration between:
- 10 the department of education, the department of health, the
- 11 department of human services, the office of youth services, and
- 12 the family court branch of the judiciary.
- 13 (b) The Wraparound Services program shall be administered
- 14 in accordance with the core principles and best practice
- 15 standards set forth in its mission statement, with a focus on:
- 16 (1) Culturally competent and individualized planning;
- 17 (2) Collaboration with peers and community members to
- engage in team based goals and efforts;
- 19 (3) Inspiring persistence and self-confidence; and
- 20 (4) Fostering an appreciation for familial dynamics and
- 21 motivating participation in activities through which

1	the child's personal strengths have been proven to
2	exceed the norm.
3	SECTION 3. Beginning no later than January 15, 2015, the
4	department of human services shall present to the legislature as
5	update on the progress made by WRAP. The presentation shall
6	include the plan used to develop the integrated system of care,
7	and provide specific recommendations relating to:
8	(1) Inadequate access to mental health care;
9	(2) Lack of social and supportive services;
10	(3) Abuse and neglect in the foster care system;
11	(4) Juvenile crime and recidivism;
12	(5) Deficits in educational achievement; and
13	(6) Child welfare policy reform.
14	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
15	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$150,000 or so much
16	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 and the
17	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
18	2015-2016 for the Wraparound Services program.
19	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
20	of human services for the purposes of this Act.
