H.B. NO. **1824**

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO KOKE'E STATE PARK ADVISORY COUNCIL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Act 223, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, 1 established the Koke'e state park advisory council, which was to 2 be responsible for, among other things, reviewing and updating 3 the Koke'e state park master plan and assisting in the 4 implementation of the master plan. Act 223 did not require the 5 advisory council to report to any entity regarding its 6 activities. Section 3 of Act 223, which established the 7 advisory council, was codified as section 171-8.5, Hawaii 8 Revised Statutes. Although the advisory council has been in 9 existence for over four years, it is unclear what, if anything, 10 the advisory council has actually accomplished with regard to 11 revising or implementing the Koke'e state park master plan. The 12 State has lost potentially \$300,000 in annual revenues from user 13 fees because the master plan has not been adopted and 14 implemented. Accordingly, the legislature believes that the 15 advisory council should be dissolved for failing to carry out 16 17 its responsibilities.



The purpose of this Act is to abolish the Koke'e state park 1 advisory council. 2 SECTION 2. Section 171-8.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is . 3 repealed. 4 ["[<u>\$171-8.5-Koke'e state park-advisory council.</u>] (a) 5 There is established a Koke'e state park advisory council, to be 6 placed within the department of land and natural resources for 7 administrative purposes only. The advisory council shall 8 consist of nine voting members appointed in equal numbers by the 9 governor, the speaker of the house of representatives and the 10 president of the senate in-accordance with section 26-34, and 11 12 four ex-officio-nonvoting members. (b) The voting members of the advisory council shall be 13 Kaua'i residents and shall possess general knowledge of at least 14 one-of the four strategic areas listed below: 15 16 (1) Education; 17 (2) Cultural resources; (3) The environment; or 18 (4) Native-plants, animals, and ecosystems. 19 (c) The ex-officio-nonvoting-members shall be as follows: 20 (1) A-representative of the United States Fish and 21
