# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Homelessness is a complex issue that requires a			
2	comprehensive and collaborative approach among public, private,			
3	nonprofit, and other community stakeholders to provide services			
4	and resources to homeless individuals and families, and to			
5	prevent homelessness. Act 279, Session Laws of Hawaii 1992,			
6	established the Hale Kokua project, a two-year homeless			
7	assistance pilot project within the Hawaii housing authority to			
8	provide incentives and assistance to private homeowners in the			
9	city and county of Honolulu who set aside existing dwelling			
10	units, constructed new dwelling units or improved existing			
11	dwelling units, for rental for a period of five years by			
12	families or individuals classified as homeless under the			
13	project.			
14	Subsequently, Act 167, Session Laws of Hawaii 1998,			
15	established the Hale Kokua program within the housing and			
16	community development corporation of Hawaii to address the issue			
17	of homelessness by providing housing and job-training for the			
18	State's homeless population. This homeless assistance program			

- 1 authorized the payment of a state grant and monthly rent
- 2 supplement to interested property owners who set aside existing
- 3 rental space or made improvements or constructed adjoining or
- 4 separate dwelling units to rent the units to families or
- 5 individuals classified as employed but homeless under the
- 6 program. The Hale Kokua program was subsequently placed under
- 7 the Hawaii public housing authority by Act 180, Session Laws of
- 8 Hawaii 2006; however, the program was later repealed by Act 89,
- 9 Session Laws of Hawaii 2010.
- 10 The legislature finds that homelessness continues to be one
- 11 of the primary challenges in the State. According to the
- 12 Homelessness Research Institute, Hawaii has the highest rate of
- 13 homeless per capita of any state with about forty-five homeless
- 14 individuals out of every ten thousand.
- 15 The purpose of this Act is to assist homeless families and
- 16 individuals in the State by establishing the Hale Kokua program
- 17 as an additional housing resource under the department of human
- 18 services.
- 19 SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 20 amended by adding a new section to part XVII to be appropriately
- 21 designated and to read as follows:

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1	"§346- Hale Kokua program; established. (a) There is
2	established a homeless assistance program known as the Hale
3	Kokua program, to provide incentives and assistance to
4	homeowners throughout the State who set aside existing dwelling
5	units for rental by families or individuals classified as
6	employed but homeless or who have steady income from a
7	government source; provided that the family or individual shall
8	be:
9	(1) Unrelated to the homeowner who sets aside any dwelling
10	unit for rental under this section; and
11	(2) Registered in the State of Hawaii homeless management
12	information system.
13	(b) The department shall hire an administrator to
14	administer and oversee the Hale Kokua program. The department
15	may utilize existing contracts with private sector agencies to
16	carry out the duties and responsibilities of the program with
17	additional resources.
18	(c) The duties of the department or contracted agency
19	shall include:
20	(1) Carrying out the requirements of the Hale Kokua
21	program utilizing the rapid re-housing model;

1	(2)	Monitoring the progress of the program and collecting
2		annual statistics showing the numbers of homeless
3		persons, homeless families, and homeless children,
4		using appropriate measurement systems; and
5	(3)	Preparing recommendations to improve and expand the
6		program including but not limited to incentives for
7		participating property owners to sign up for
8		additional terms.
9	(d)	The department shall limit participation to not more
10	than ten	property owners within each census tract at any given
11	period in	time, without regard to the existence or operation of
12	shelters	and other facilities to aid the homeless in the tract.
13	The depar	tment or contracted agency shall notify prospective
14	participa	nts registered on the waiting list in each census tract
15	of the op	portunity to participate in the program as these
16	opportuni	ties may arise in each tract.
17	(e)	All rental subsidies and payments allocated by the
18	program u	nder this section shall be subject to the availability
19	of funds.	
20	(f)	As used in this section, unless the context clearly
21	requires	otherwise:

1	"Administrator" means the state homeless section		
2	administrator.		
3	"Employed but homeless" means any person who is homeless as		
4	defined in section 346-361 and:		
5	(1) Is employed at least nineteen hours per week; or		
6	(2) Participates in an employment training program and		
7	does volunteer work for a total of nineteen hours per		
8	week until employment can be found."		
9	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general		
10	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so		
11	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for		
12	the homeless programs office of the department of human services		
13	to:		
14	(1) Establish one full-time equivalent (1.00 FTE)		
15	permanent state homeless section administrator in the		
16	department of human services to head and oversee the		
17	Hale Kokua program;		
18	(2) Implement the Hale Kokua program; and		
19	(3) Carry out the purposes of this Act.		
20	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department o		
21	human services for the purposes of this Act.		
22	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.		

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1 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2025.

### Report Title:

Homeless; Hale Kokua Program; Appropriation

#### Description:

Establishes the Hale Kokua Program within the Department of Human Services to incentivize homeowners statewide to set aside dwelling units for rental by families or individuals classified as employed but homeless or who have steady income from a government source. Appropriates funds for the Hale Kokua Program. Effective July 1, 2025. (SD1)

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
