

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PETS IN RESTAURANTS AND BARS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTI	ION 1. Chapter 321 Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding	a new section to be appropriately designated and to
3	read as fo	ollows:
4	" <u>§321</u>	Pets allowed in restaurants and bars. (a)
5	Notwithsta	anding any law or rule to the contrary, except as
6	provided i	in subsections (f) and (g), at the discretion of the
7	owner or n	nanager of an establishment, each establishment patron
8	may bring	a maximum of one pet into the establishment under the
9	following	conditions:
10	(1)	The owner or manager of an establishment shall
11		designate an area of the establishment where pets are
12		allowed;
13	(2)	The pet shall be under the control of the patron at
14		all times, on a leash that is tied or fastened to keep
15		the pet within two feet of the patron or held within a
16		container;
17	<u>(3)</u>	The pet or the container shall be placed and remain or
18		the floor at the patron's seating area;

1	(4)	The pet shall not interfere with the activities of the
2		establishment's employees, obstruct any pathways, or
3		enter food preparation areas;
4	(5)	A pet that is on a leash shall not relieve itself
5		within the establishment;
6	(6)	No pet shall bark, create any other noise audible to
7		other patrons, or otherwise disturb other patrons;
8	<u>(7)</u>	An establishment owner, manager, or employee may
9		refuse admittance of any patron with a pet; and
10	(8)	The pet and patron shall abide by any other conditions
11		that the owner or manager of the establishment may
12		impose.
13	<u>(b)</u>	An establishment that permits pets in the
14	<u>establish</u>	ment shall have safety and sanitation control
15	procedure	s in effect to:
16	<u>(1)</u>	Immediately clean any pet feces, urine, waste, saliva,
17		vomitus, or other animal fluids, and properly
18		disinfect contaminated areas and surfaces;
19	(2)	Prevent animal waste from entering food preparation
20		areas including ensuring that establishment employees
21		assigned to clean up pet feces, urine, waste, saliva,
22		vomitus, or other animal fluids shall thoroughly wash

1	and sanitize their hands and arms up to the elbow
2	prior to returning to any food preparation, other
3	cleaning, or handling of any food equipment or
4	utensils.
5	(c) An establishment that permits pets in the
6	establishment shall post prominently at each entrance a sign
7	displaying the message, "Pets are allowed in this establishment.
8	The presence of pets in this establishment may place you at a
9	greater risk of contracting a food borne illness". The
10	establishment shall post adjacent to that sign a list of all
11	conditions contained in subsection (a) and a clear description
12	of any additional conditions imposed by the owner or manager of
13	the establishment on pet owners, pet handlers, and pets while
14	present in the establishment.
15	(d) If any of the conditions in subsection (a) are not
16	met, the owner or manager of the establishment may require the
17	patron to remove the pet from the establishment.
18	(e) The establishment patron who brings a pet into the
19	establishment, and the pet's owner if the owner is not the
20	patron, shall be liable for any and all property damage and
21	personal injury that the pet may cause while in the
22	establishment, including any damage or injury to other pets.

1	(f) If any provisions of this section conflict with state
2	or federal law governing guide or service animals, the federal
3	<pre>law shall prevail.</pre>
4	(g) Nothing in this section shall diminish the rights of
5	persons with disabilities to request and obtain reasonable
6	accommodations under chapter 489.
7	(h) Nothing in this section shall prohibit patrol dogs
8	accompanying security or police officers from entering any area
9	of the establishment.
10	(i) As used in this section unless the context clearly
11	requires otherwise, the terms:
12	"Bar" means an establishment that is devoted to the serving
13	of alcoholic beverages for consumption by guests on the premises
14	regardless of whether food is served, including but not limited
15	to taverns, cocktail lounges, and cabarets, including outdoor
16	areas of bars;
17	"Establishment" means bar or restaurant;
18	"Pet" means a dog or cat;
19	"Restaurant" means any place where food is served or
20	provided to the public at a charge, including outdoor seating
21	areas, regardless of whether food is consumed on or off the

premises; provided that the term restaurant shall not include
