A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 The legislature finds that sexuality health education promotes healthy attitudes on adolescent growth and 2 development, body image, gender and sexuality, dating, 3 relationships, and family. The legislature also finds that 4 sexuality health education should positively affect adolescent 5 behavior and provide teens with the information, skills, and 6 7 support needed to develop positive values, make healthy decisions, and respect the important role that sexuality plays 8 9 throughout a person's life. The legislature further finds that, in the past three 10 11 years, several states, including Hawaii, have enacted laws that require school districts that teach sexuality health education 12 13 to include age-appropriate and medically accurate health
- 14 education. The legislature also finds, however, that the
 15 effectiveness of sexuality health education in Hawaii's schools

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1 flexibility in the implementation of the curricula, and greater 2 public access to the curricula. 3 The purpose of this Act is to: 4 (1) Add specific requirements to Hawaii's existing 5 sexuality health education law; (2) Require the board of education and department of 6 7 education to collaborate to develop, maintain, and make available to the public a list of sexuality 8 9 health education curricula; and 10 (3) Allow parents to request that their children not 11 receive the sexuality health education provided 12 pursuant to Hawaii's sexuality health education law. SECTION 2. Section 321-11.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 14 amended to read as follows: "[+] §321-11.1[+] Medically accurate sexuality health 15 (a) Sexuality health education programs funded by 16 education. the State shall provide medically accurate and factual 17 18 information that [is]: Is age appropriate [and includes]; 19 (1)(2) Includes education on abstinence, contraception, and 20

methods of disease prevention to prevent unintended

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1		pregnancy and sexually transmitted disease, including
2		human immunodeficiency virus[+];
3	<u>(3)</u>	Helps students develop relationships and communication
4		skills to form healthy relationships that are based or
5		mutual respect and affection and free from violence,
6		coercion, and intimidation;
7	(4)	Helps students develop skills in critical thinking,
8		problem solving, decision making, and stress
9		management to make healthy decisions about sexuality
10		and relationships; and
11	<u>(5)</u>	Encourages students to communicate with their parents,
12		guardians, and other trusted adults about sexuality
13		and intimate relations.
14	(b)	At a teacher's discretion, the teacher may answer in
15	good fait	h any question initiated by a student or students that
16	<u>is reason</u>	ably related to and consistent with the material of a
17	course provided pursuant to subsection (a).	
18	(c)	The department of education may eliminate or modify
19	component	s of instruction under subsection (a)(2) in elementary
20	school fo	r reasons of age appropriateness.
21	<u>(d)</u>	Sexuality health education under subsection (a) shall
22	not discr	iminate on the basis of sex, race, ethnicity, national
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- 1 origin, disability, religion, sexual orientation, or gender
- 2 identity.
- 3 (e) The board of education shall collaborate with the
- 4 department of education to develop, maintain, and make available
- 5 to the public a current list of sexuality health education
- 6 curricula that are consistent with the requirements under
- 7 subsection (a).
- 8 (f) A student shall be excused from any part of the
- 9 instruction provided pursuant to this section only upon the
- 10 written request of the student's parent or legal guardian. A
- 11 student may not be subject to disciplinary action, academic
- 12 penalty, or other sanction if the student's parent or legal
- 13 guardian requests that the student not receive the instruction
- 14 provided under this section.
- 15 (q) The department of education shall establish minimum
- 16 education and training qualifications for sexuality health
- 17 education teachers.
- 18 [(b)] (h) For the purposes of this section:
- 19 "Age appropriate" means suitable to a particular age or age
- 20 group based on developing cognitive, emotional, and behavioral
- 21 capacity typical for that age or age group.

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"Factual information" means medical, psychiatric, 1 2 psychological, empirical, or statistical information that is 3 verified or supported by research conducted by recognized medical, psychiatric, psychological, and public health 4 5 professionals or organizations. "Medically accurate" means verified or supported by 6 7 research conducted in compliance with accepted scientific 8 methods and recognized as accurate and objective by professional 9 organizations and agencies with expertise in the relevant field, 10 such as the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the American Public Health Association, the American Academy of 11 Pediatrics, and the American College of Obstetricians and 12 13 Gynecologists. "Sexuality health education" means education in any medium 14 regarding human development and sexuality, including education 15 on pregnancy, family planning, and sexually transmitted 16 diseases." 17 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 19
