
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that sexuality health
2 education promotes healthy attitudes on adolescent growth and
3 development, body image, gender and sexuality, dating,
4 relationships, and family. The legislature also finds that
5 sexuality health education should positively affect adolescent
6 behavior and provide teens with the information, skills, and
7 support needed to develop positive values, make healthy
8 decisions, and respect the important role that sexuality plays
9 throughout a person's life.

10 The legislature further finds that, in the past three
11 years, several states, including Hawaii, have enacted laws that
12 require school districts that teach sexuality health education
13 to include age-appropriate and medically accurate health
14 education. The legislature also finds, however, that the
15 effectiveness of sexuality health education in Hawaii's schools
16 could be bolstered by providing clearer guidance on a
17 comprehensive approach to sexuality health education, greater



1 flexibility in the implementation of the curricula, and greater
2 public access to the curricula.

3 The purpose of this Act is to:

- 4 (1) Add specific requirements to Hawaii's existing
5 sexuality health education law;
- 6 (2) Require the board of education and department of
7 education to collaborate to develop, maintain, and
8 make available to the public a list of sexuality
9 health education curricula; and
- 10 (3) Allow parents to request that their children not
11 receive the sexuality health education provided
12 pursuant to Hawaii's sexuality health education law.

13 SECTION 2. Section 321-11.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14 amended to read as follows:

15 "[~~§~~§321-11.1[~~]~~] **Medically accurate sexuality health**
16 **education.** (a) Sexuality health education programs funded by
17 the State shall provide medically accurate and factual
18 information that [~~is~~]:

- 19 (1) Is age appropriate [~~and includes~~];
- 20 (2) Includes education on abstinence, contraception, and
21 methods of disease prevention to prevent unintended



1 pregnancy and sexually transmitted disease, including
2 human immunodeficiency virus[-];

3 (3) Helps students develop relationships and communication
4 skills to form healthy relationships that are based on
5 mutual respect and affection and free from violence,
6 coercion, and intimidation;

7 (4) Helps students develop skills in critical thinking,
8 problem solving, decision making, and stress
9 management to make healthy decisions about sexuality
10 and relationships; and

11 (5) Encourages students to communicate with their parents,
12 guardians, and other trusted adults about sexuality
13 and intimate relations.

14 (b) At a teacher's discretion, the teacher may answer in
15 good faith any question initiated by a student or students that
16 is reasonably related to and consistent with the material of a
17 course provided pursuant to subsection (a).

18 (c) The department of education may eliminate or modify
19 components of instruction under subsection (a)(2) in elementary
20 school for reasons of age appropriateness.

21 (d) Sexuality health education under subsection (a) shall
22 not discriminate on the basis of sex, race, ethnicity, national



1 origin, disability, religion, sexual orientation, or gender
2 identity.

3 (e) The board of education shall collaborate with the
4 department of education to develop, maintain, and make available
5 to the public a current list of sexuality health education
6 curricula that are consistent with the requirements under
7 subsection (a).

8 (f) A student shall be excused from any part of the
9 instruction provided pursuant to this section only upon the
10 written request of the student's parent or legal guardian. A
11 student may not be subject to disciplinary action, academic
12 penalty, or other sanction if the student's parent or legal
13 guardian requests that the student not receive the instruction
14 provided under this section.

15 (g) The department of education shall establish minimum
16 education and training qualifications for sexuality health
17 education teachers.

18 [~~(b)~~] (h) For the purposes of this section:

19 "Age appropriate" means suitable to a particular age or age
20 group based on developing cognitive, emotional, and behavioral
21 capacity typical for that age or age group.



1 "Factual information" means medical, psychiatric,
2 psychological, empirical, or statistical information that is
3 verified or supported by research conducted by recognized
4 medical, psychiatric, psychological, and public health
5 professionals or organizations.

6 "Medically accurate" means verified or supported by
7 research conducted in compliance with accepted scientific
8 methods and recognized as accurate and objective by professional
9 organizations and agencies with expertise in the relevant field,
10 such as the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention,
11 the American Public Health Association, the American Academy of
12 Pediatrics, and the American College of Obstetricians and
13 Gynecologists.


14 "Sexuality health education" means education in any medium
15 regarding human development and sexuality, including education
16 on pregnancy, family planning, and sexually transmitted
17 diseases."

18 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

20 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
