A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The Sand Island land and ocean affects
- 2 thousands of people, both as an area of recreation and business.
- 3 Because Sand Island has great potential to generate revenue
- 4 activities, a task force should review a smart growth plan
- 5 before any development starts.
- 6 SECTION 2. (a) There shall be established within the
- 7 department of land and natural resources the Sand Island task
- 8 force. The task force shall review the Sand Island ocean
- 9 recreation park master plan.
- 10 The task force shall be dissolved on June 30, 2015.
- 11 (b) The department of land and natural resources shall
- 12 provide administrative support, including the recording of
- 13 minutes, to the Sand Island task force.
- 14 (c) The task force shall consist of the following members:
- 15 (1) The chairperson of the board of land and natural
- resources or the chairperson's designee;

1	(3)	A member of the senate, appointed by the senate
2		president;
3	(4)	A member of the house of representatives, appointed by
4		the speaker of the house of representatives; and
5	(5)	At least six community members representing canoe
6		paddlers, swimmers, bikers, and recreation members who
7		frequent the Sand Island land and ocean; provided that
8		two shall be chosen by the governor, two shall be
9		chosen'by the senate president, and two shall be
10		chosen by the speaker of the house of representatives.
11	The	members of the task force shall serve without

- 4 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 6 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the
- 7 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 8 2016-2017 for the construction of amenities included in the Sand
- 9 Island ocean recreation park master plan.
- 10 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department

- 19 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 20 of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
