A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUNTING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that mentored hunting, also called apprentice hunting, allows a person to try hunting 2 prior to completing any required hunter education courses and 3 4 allows young hunters and their families to enjoy sporting traditions together. Presently, more than half of the states in 5 6 the nation operate a mentored hunting program. These programs attract new hunters of all ages by allowing the prospective 7 hunter to gain experience under the direct supervision of a 8 9 seasoned mentor. These programs also allow for young hunters' 10 earliest hunting experiences to involve active participation, rather than classroom hunter education courses. 11 12 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of

The purpose of this Act is to require the department of land and natural resources to issue Hawaii hunting apprentice permits authorizing persons without a hunting license, including children, to hunt under direct supervision of a licensed hunter, with certain restrictions for apprentice permittees who are ten years old or younger.
