A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BIOSECURITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the unchecked spread 2 of invasive species is one of the greatest threats to Hawaii's

of invasive species is one of the greatest threats to Hawaii's

3 economy, natural environment, and the health and lifestyle of

4 Hawaii's people. Invasive pests can cause millions of dollars

5 in crop losses, the extinction of native species, the

6 destruction of native forests, the spread of disease, and the

7 quarantine of exported agricultural crops.

8 Island ecosystems are particularly vulnerable to the

destructive power of invasive pests. In Guam, the accidental

10 introduction of the brown tree snake has resulted in widespread

11 devastation. Without natural predators or competition for food,

12 brown tree snake populations have grown exponentially, causing

13 mass extinctions of endemic birds. Where there were once bird

14 songs, the silent forests of Guam are now home to as many as

15 fifteen thousand snakes per square mile. Just one new pest like

16 the brown tree snake could forever change the character of the

17 Hawaiian Islands.

1	Despite our ongoing efforts to detect and eradicate					
2	invasive species, our fragile island ecosystems are constantly at					
3	risk from insects, disease-bearing organisms, snakes, weeds, and other					
4	invasive pests. The coqui frog, Salvinia molesta, Miconia					
5	calvescens, ohia rust, nettle caterpillar, and little fire ant					
6	are all present in Hawaii, disrupting the delicate balance of our					
7	ecosystems, crowding out native species, and reducing the					
8	biodiversity of our islands.					
9	The department of agriculture has created a biosecurity					
10	program to fight invasive species on several fronts by:					
11	(1) Administering pre-entry measures to minimize the risk					
12	of invasive pests entering the State;					
13	(2) Conducting port-of-entry inspections to detect and					
14	quarantine or destroy pests upon arrival; and					
15	(3) Administering post-entry measures to mitigate the					
16	establishment of pests in the State.					
17	The department has also supported the growth of Hawaii's					
18	agriculture by attempting to reduce the State's dependency on					
19	imported agricultural products that may contain pests. The					

legislature finds that sufficient support for a biosecurity

program is vital to the public's health and welfare.

1	The purpose of this Act is to reaffirm the legislature's
2	finding that the implementation of the department of
3	agriculture's biosecurity program is vital to the State and
4	requires the department to complete the implementation of the
5	program.
6	SECTION 2. Section 150A-53, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended to read as follows:
8	"[+]§150A-53[+] General actions to achieve objectives. To
9	achieve the objectives of the biosecurity program, the
10	department shall plan for and, within available legislative
11	appropriations, implement the following:
12	(1) Work with government agencies and agricultural
13	commodity exporters of other states and countries to
14	establish pre-entry inspection programs under which
15	inbound cargo into the State is inspected at the ports
16	of departure or other points outside the State;
17	(2) Establish, operate, or participate in operating port-
18	of-entry facilities where multiple government agencies
19	may inspect, quarantine, fumigate, disinfect, destroy,
20	or exclude as appropriate, articles that may harbor
21	pests or exclude articles that are prohibited or
22	restricted without a permit, with the goals of:

1		(A)	Performing inspections in an efficient,
2			effective, and expeditious manner for the
3			government agencies involved and for cargo
4			owners, carriers, and importers; [and]
5		(B)	Providing for the proper and safe storage and
6			handling of cargo, especially agricultural and
7			food commodities, awaiting inspection; and
8		<u>(C)</u>	Establishing or participating in private-public
9			partnerships to enhance the biosecurity program
10			and quarantine inspection process with on-port
11			and off-port facilities, including inspection and
12			treatment facilities, transitional facilities,
13			and consolidation and deconsolidation facilities;
14	(3)	Deve	lop, implement, and coordinate post-entry measures
15		to e	radicate, control, reduce, and suppress pests and,
16		as a	ppropriate, eradicate or seize and dispose of
17		proh	ibited or restricted organisms without a permit
18		that	have entered the State;
19	(4)	Coll	aborate with relevant government agencies,
20		agri	cultural commodity importers, and other persons to
21		exam	ine and develop joint integrated systems to better
22		impl	ement the biosecurity program;

1	(5)	Improve cargo inspection capabilities and methods,			
2		including enhancement of the content and submission			
3		requirements for cargo manifests and agricultural			
4		commodity ownership and movement certificates;			
5	(6)	Promote the production of agricultural commodities in			
6		the State to reduce cargo shipments of imported			
7		commodities into the State; and			
8	(7)	Provide public education on the negative effects of			
9		pests and prohibited or restricted organisms without a			
10		permit, to the environment and economy of the State."			
11	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general			
12	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so			
13	much there	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for			
14	the biose	curity program of the department of agriculture.			
15	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of			
16	agriculture for the purposes of this Act.

19	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
