A BILL FOR AN ACT

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RELATING TO HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PARI I
2	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that homelessness
3	continues to be one of the State's most significant and
4	challenging social problems. The legislature further finds that
5	according to a recent report, fourteen thousand two hundred
6	homeless individuals were served through shelter and outreach
7	programs in fiscal year 2011. Of these individuals, nine
8	thousand seven hundred eighty-one resided in the city and county
9	of Honolulu. The legislature also finds that homeless service
10	providers estimate that six thousand homeless people in the
11	State need shelter each night.
12	The legislature additionally finds that homelessness is a
13	complex issue that requires continuous resources and coordinated
14	efforts at all levels. The legislature also finds that homeless
15	persons face a myriad of issues, including mental illness,
16	substance abuse, loss of employment and income, and a lack of
17	affordable housing. Appropriate funding for programs and
18	services tailored to address these issues is essential.
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- 1 The purpose of this part is to better assist individuals
- 2 facing or experiencing homelessness by funding various homeless
- 3 and housing programs.
- 4 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 6 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for
- 7 substance abuse treatment and mental health support services for
- 8 individuals who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless.
- 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 10 health for the purposes of this part.
- 11 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 13 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for
- 14 clean and sober housing support services to be administered by
- 15 the alcohol and drug abuse division of the department of health.
- 16 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 17 health for the purposes of this part.
- 18 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 20 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for
- 21 the Hawaii public housing authority's rent supplement program to
- 22 assist families with very low incomes who could become homeless



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- 2 (0.75 FTE) position shall be established to administer the
- 3 current program; provided further that the 0.75 full time
- 4 equivalent position established pursuant to this section shall
- 5 be in addition to existing rent supplement program positions.
- 6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public
- 7 housing authority for the purposes of this part.
- 8 PART II
- 9 SECTION 5. The legislature finds that housing first
- 10 programs are a collaborative effort between the department of
- 11 human services and the United States Department of Housing and
- 12 Urban Development that provides housing and support services for
- 13 chronically homeless individuals, including those who have an
- 14 addiction or mental illness, or both. The principles of housing
- 15 first programs include:
- 16 (1) Moving chronically homeless individuals into housing
- 17 directly from streets and the shelters without a
- 18 precondition of accepting or complying with treatment;
- 19 (2) Providing robust support services for program
- 20 participants that are predicated on assertive
- 21 engagement rather than coercion;

1	(3)	Granting chronically homeless individuals priority as				
2		program participants in housing first programs;				
3	(4)	Embracing a harm-reduction approach to addictions				
4		rather than mandating abstinence while supporting				
5		program participant commitments to recovery; and				
6	(5)	Providing program participants with leases and tenant				
7		protections as provided by law.				
8	The	purpose of this part is to appropriate funds to the				
9	departmen	t of human services to support the State's housing				
10	first programs in assisting Hawaii's chronically homeless who					
11	are often the most vulnerable, most visible, and most difficult					
12	to serve.					
13	SECT	ION 6. There is appropriated out of the general				
14	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so				
15	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 to be					
16	deposited to the credit of the housing first special fund					
17	established under section 346-377, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for					
18	the department of human services to continue to administer					
19	housing f	irst programs for chronically homeless individuals in				
20	the State	•				
21	SECT	ION 7. There is appropriated out of the housing first				
22	special f	und the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be				

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- 1 necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for the department of human
- 2 services to continue to administer housing first programs for
- 3 chronically homeless individuals in the State.
- 4 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 5 human services for the purposes of this part.
- 6 PART III
- 7 SECTION 8. The legislature finds that the purpose of the
- 8 United States Department of Housing and Urban Development's
- 9 homelessness prevention and rapid re-housing program is to
- 10 provide economically distressed households and individuals with
- 11 financial and other assistance to prevent them from becoming
- 12 homeless and help those who are experiencing homelessness to be
- 13 quickly re-housed and stabilized. The funds under this program
- 14 are intended to target individuals and families who would be
- 15 homeless but for this assistance.
- 16 The department of human services administers the
- 17 homelessness prevention and rapid re-housing program to provide
- 18 homeless prevention and housing assistance to all eligible
- 19 individuals and households who apply through contracted
- 20 organizations. The funds from the program provide for a variety
- 21 of assistance, including short-term or medium-term rental
- 22 assistance and housing relocation, and stabilization services,

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- 1 such as mediation, security or utility deposits, utility
- 2 payments, moving cost assistance, and case management.
- 3 The purpose of this part is to appropriate funds to the
- 4 department of human services to provide homelessness prevention
- 5 and rapid re-housing assistance to all eligible individuals and
- 6 households.
- 7 SECTION 9. There is appropriated out of the general
- 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 9 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for
- 10 the homelessness prevention and rapid re-housing program.
- 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 12 human services for the purposes of this part.
- 13 PART IV
- 14 SECTION 10. The continuum of care permanent supportive
- 15 housing programs funded by the United States Department of
- 16 Housing and Urban Development provide rental assistance in
- 17 connection with supportive services. The programs provide a
- 18 variety of permanent housing choices, accompanied by a range of
- 19 supportive services funded through other sources. The programs
- 20 assist hard-to-serve homeless individuals with disabilities and
- 21 their families. These individuals primarily include those with

- 1 serious mental illness, chronic problems with alcohol and drugs,
- 2 and HIV, AIDS, or related diseases.
- 3 There are four components to the continuum of care
- 4 permanent supportive housing programs: single room occupancy
- 5 component moderate rehabilitation for single-room occupancy
- 6 dwellings; sponsor-based rental assistance component; project-
- 7 based rental assistance component; and tenant-based rental
- 8 assistance component. Under all components, supportive services
- 9 must be available to meet the needs of participants. Similar to
- 10 many other federal programs, continuum of care permanent
- 11 supportive housing programs have a match requirement.
- 12 Applicants must match the aggregate amount of continuum of care
- 13 rental assistance with supportive services. This ensures that
- 14 appropriate and timely services will be available to meet the
- 15 needs of individual participants.
- 16 The purpose of this part is to provide matching funds for
- 17 the continuum of care permanent supportive housing programs of
- 18 the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development.
- 19 SECTION 11. There is appropriated out of the general
- 20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 21 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for
- 22 matching funds for the continuum of care permanent supportive

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- 1 housing programs of the United States Department of Housing and
- 2 Urban Development.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 human services for the purposes of this part.
- 5 PART V
- 6 SECTION 12. The legislature finds that homelessness
- 7 continues to be one of the State's most significant and
- 8 challenging social problems. The number of homeless persons in
- 9 the State, estimated to be approximately six thousand on any
- 10 given day, is indicative of the limited shelter space available.
- 11 The legislature further finds that new and innovative
- 12 solutions are needed to address the homelessness crisis.
- 13 Oregon, for example, has adopted laws that authorize political
- 14 subdivisions to allow religious institutions to offer overnight
- 15 camping space for homeless persons living in vehicles.
- 16 Similarly, Santa Barbara, California, has instituted a program
- 17 that allows private organizations to use county-owned parking
- 18 lots to provide overnight sleeping space for homeless persons
- 19 with vehicles.
- 20 Act 222, Session Laws of Hawaii 2013, established a
- 21 homeless assistance working to group to work within each local
- 22 neighborhood in each county to identify, plan, and implement

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- 1 housing options for homeless persons in each local community
- 2 that reflect shared responsibility for addressing homelessness
- 3 in Hawaii.
- 4 The purpose of this part is to appropriate funds for the
- 5 purchase and construction of housing solutions related to the
- 6 homeless assistance working group's findings and
- 7 recommendations.
- 8 SECTION 13. There is appropriated out of the general
- 9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 10 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for
- 11 the purchase and construction of innovative housing solutions
- 12 for homeless persons as they relate to the working group's
- 13 findings and recommendations; provided that:
- 14 (1) The purchase and construction of innovative housing
- 15 solutions pursuant to this section shall not be
- 16 subject to chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes; and
- 17 (2) The housing created pursuant to this section shall be
- ready for use and fully occupied by December 1, 2014.
- 19 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
- 20 housing finance and development corporation for the purposes of
- 21 this part.

2	SECT	ION 14. Act 222, Session Laws of Hawaii 2013, section
3	16, is am	ended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as
4	follows:	
5	"(a)	There is established [within the department of human
6	services]	a homeless assistance working group. The purpose of
7	the worki	ng group shall be to:
8	(1)	Work within each local neighborhood in each county to
9		identify various private and public properties whose
10		owners are interested in partnering with the local
11		neighborhood and government to provide land or
12		structures that can be used to provide temporary homes
13		for homeless persons, including people who are living
14		in their motor vehicles;
15	(2)	Coordinate with the State's homeless programs office
16		and continuum of care providers to match homeless
17		persons in every community with appropriate care and
18		housing;
19	(3)	Work with non-profit organizations, businesses, and
20		government agencies that may be willing to offer their
21		property for homeless persons living in their motor

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1	venicles and coordinate voluntary participation and						
2	support to homeless persons;						
3	(4)	Create, develop, and support the housing options					
4		within each local community; and					
5	(5)	Communicate and coordinate with the Hawaii interagency					
6		council on homelessness on meeting their goals.					
7	(b)	[The director of human services, or a designee,] The					
8	chairpersons of the senate and house of representatives						
9	committee	s on human services shall convene the working group and					
10	invite the following as members:						
11	(1)	Representatives of homeless service providers;					
12 .	(2)	Representatives of community and volunteer service					
13		organizations, which may include:					
14		(A) Community associations;					
15		(B) Neighborhood boards; and					
16		(C) Faith-based organizations;					
17	(3)	Representatives of property owners who are interested					
18	in partnering with the State to provide land, homes,						
19	or buildings that can be used to provide homes for						
20	homeless persons;						

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1	(4)	Representatives of the homeless community who are				
2		currently experiencing or formerly experienced				
3		homelessness;				
4	(5)	Representatives of environmental organizations;				
5	(6)	Representatives of the architecture, engineering,				
6		development, and building industry;				
7	(7)	Representatives of other businesses, including				
8		realtors and financial institutions;				
9	(8)	Representatives of labor unions;				
10	. (9)	Representatives of legal services;				
11	(10)	Representatives of the technology community;				
12	(11)	Various federal, state, and county and city				
13		representatives, including the chair of the Hawaii				
14		interagency council on homelessness and homeless				
15		programs office administrator;				
16	(12)	Interested federal, state, county, and city elected				
17		officials; and				
18	(13)	Others interested in supporting homeless assistance.				
19	The membe	rs of the working group shall designate a chair from				
20	among themselves and serve without compensation."
