

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii is very		
2	dependent on imported oil for its energy needs. Encouraging		
3	different modes of transportation that use alternative energy		
4	can help to reduce oil dependency. Although bicycles may		
5	currently be operated on various types of pathways, bicycles		
6	powered by means other than human power, such as an electric		
7	motor, are currently not allowed to be similarly operated.		
8	Allowing electronic bicycles may result in increased usage of		
9	this means of transportation which can reduce dependency on		
10	foreign oil.		
11	SECTION 2. Section 291C-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
12	amended by amending the definition of "bicycle" to read as		
13	follows:		
14	""Bicycle" means [every]:		
15	(1) A vehicle propelled solely by human power upon which		
16	any person may ride, having two tandem wheels, and		
17	including any vehicle generally recognized as a

1		bicycle though equipped with two front or two rear
2		wheels except a toy bicycle[-]; or
3	(2)	A two- or three-wheeled vehicle with fully operable
4		pedals and an electric motor of less than seven
5		hundred fifty watts or one horsepower, whose maximum
6		speed on a paved level surface, when powered solely by
7		such motor while ridden by a person who weighs one
.8		hundred seventy pounds, is less than twenty miles per
9		hour."
10	SECT	ION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
11	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.
12	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
