A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS BY MAIL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 11-91.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "[+]\$11-91.5[+] Federal, state, and county elections by
- 4 mail. (a) Any federal, state, or county election [held-other
- 5 than on the date of a regularly scheduled primary or general
- 6 election] may be conducted in whole or in part by mail[-],
- 7 including the designation of specific precincts or counties for
- 8 elections conducted in whole or in part by mail.
- 9 (b) The chief election officer shall determine whether a
- 10 federal [or] election, state election, [other-than a regularly
- 11 scheduled primary or general election, an election for both
- 12 state and county offices, or an election for both federal and
- 13 county offices, may be conducted by mail [ex], at polling
- 14 places [-], or by a combination of mail and polling places.
- (c) The county clerk shall determine whether a solely
- 16 county election [, held other than on the date of a regularly
- 17 scheduled primary or general election, may be conducted by mail

2	under the	supervision of the county clerk.
3	<u>(d)</u>	Voters may vote by absentee ballot at an absentee
4	polling p	lace. For purposes of an election by mail, the county
5	clerk, or	the chief election officer in the case of an election
6	by mail fo	or only state or federal offices, shall designate at
7	least one	absentee polling place to be open on the day of the
8	election.	
9	<u>(e)</u>	Expenses for elections by mail shall be shared as
10	follows:	
11	(1)	Expenses related to an election by mail involving both
12		state and county offices, or both federal and county
13		offices, and unrelated to voter registration and
14		absentee voting, shall be divided in half between the
15		State and the counties. Each county shall pay a
16		proration of expenses as a proportion of the
17		registered voters at the time of the general election.
18		The counties shall separately be responsible for
19		expenses associated with voter registration and
20		absentee voting.
21	(2)	All expenses for a county election by mail that does
22		not involve state or federal offices shall be borne by



1		the county and paid out of such appropriations as may
2		be made by the council.
3	(3)	All expenses for a state or federal election that does
4		not involve county offices, including expenses
5		attributable to registration of voters by the county
6		clerk, shall be borne by the State and paid out of
7		such appropriations as may be made by the legislature.
8	<u>(f)</u>	Election responsibilities for elections by mail shall
9	be shared	as follows:
10	(1)	In an election by mail involving both state and county
11		offices, or both federal and county offices, the
12		counties shall be responsible for voter registration
13		and absentee voting, and the State shall be
14		responsible for the mailing, receipt, processing, and
15		tabulation of ballots;
16	(2)	The county shall be responsible for elections by mail
17		involving only county offices; and
18	(3)	For elections by mail involving only state or federal
19		offices, the counties shall be responsible for voter
20		registration and absentee voting, and the State shall
21		be responsible for the mailing, receipt, processing,
22		and tabulation of ballots.

- 4 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 6 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and
- 7 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 8 year 2014-2015 to research and plan an election by mail system.
- 9 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 10 elections for the purposes of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

13 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2013.
