A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONSUMER PROTECTION.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that twenty-seven states
2	have laws on ticket scalping. These laws vary from complete
3	bans on ticket scalping; capping the profit that ticket scalpers
4	can make; restricting the time, place, and manner of ticket
5	scalping; and regulating scalpers through licensing and other
6	requirements. Twenty other states do not regulate ticket
7	scalping at the state level and leave the regulation of ticket
8	scalping up to local authorities. However, the legislature
9	further finds that Hawaii only prohibits ticket scalping at
10	boxing and mixed martial arts events.
11	The legislature additionally finds that when events sell
12	out, a secondary market of profiteers, known as scalpers, begins
13	to profit from the scarcity of tickets, much to the dismay of
14	potential buyers who were unable to acquire tickets through
15	primary channels. The resale of tickets at prices far in excess
16	of the tickets' face value hurts all parties connected with a
17	promotion, except the scalper. The use of illicit computer
18	software, known as bots, to electronically circumvent the ticket

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1	buying pro	ocess also impedes the public's fair access to ticket
2	sales.	
3	The :	legislature therefore concludes that state regulation
. 4	of ticket	sales practices and ticket scalping will benefit
5	Hawaii co	nsumers.
6	Acco	rdingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
7	(1)	Prohibit the sale of tickets to an exhibition, game,
8		concert, and other events at prices greater than the
9		sum of the price printed on the ticket, any lawful
10		taxes collected, and any reasonable charge for
11		services;
12	(2)	Specify that no ticket sales for events in Hawaii
13		shall commence before 8:00 a.m. Hawaiian standard time
14		or before the primary ticket seller commences ticket
15		sales, whichever is later;
16	(3)	Specify requirements for tickets sold or offered for
17		sale through an internet website;
18	(4)	Establish requirements for disclosures relating to
19		fees and taxes and number of available tickets;
20	(5)	Establish remedies for violations of event ticket

sales practices and ticket scalping; and

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1	(6) Make the circumvention of online ticket purchase				
2	limits through the use of illicit computer software a				
3	misdemeanor.				
4	SECTION 2. Chapter 481B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is				
5	amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and				
6	to read as follows:				
7	"PART . EVENT TICKET SALES PRACTICES AND TICKET SCALPING				
8	§481B-A Definitions. As used in this part, unless the				
9	context requires otherwise:				
10	"Primary ticket seller" means an owner or operator of a				
11	venue or sports team, manager or provider of an event, event				
12	promoter, a provider of ticketing services or an agent of the				
13	owner, operator, manager or provider, that engages in the				
14	primary sale of tickets for an event or retains the authority t				
15	otherwise distribute tickets.				
16	§481B-B Ticket sales; price limitations; website sales				
17	requirements. (a) Subject to subsection (b), no person shall				
18	sell or offer for sale any ticket of admission or any other				
19	evidence of a right of entry to an exhibition, game, contest,				
20	athletic competition, concert, performance, or any other event,				
21	at a price greater than the sum of:				
22	(1) The price printed on the ticket;				

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1	(2)	Any tax that the seller may lawfully collect on the
2		price printed on the ticket; and
3	(3)	Any reasonable charge for services actually rendered
4		and directly relating to the cost of selling or
5		offering to sell the ticket, which charge shall not
6		exceed four hundred per cent of the price printed on
7		the ticket.
8	·(b)	Ticket sales for an event in Hawaii shall not commence
9	before 8:	00 a.m. Hawaiian standard time or before the primary
10	ticket se	ller commences ticket sales, whichever is later.
11	(C)	If the ticket is sold or offered for sale by or
12	through a	n internet website by a person other than a primary
13	ticket se	ller, the website operator shall:
14	(1)	Guarantee a full refund of the amount paid for the
15		ticket, and any applicable servicing, handling, or
16		processing fees, if:
17		(A) The ticketed event is canceled;
18		(B) The purchaser is denied admission to the ticketed
19		event, unless the denial is due to the action or
20		omission of the purchaser; or
21		(C) The ticket is not delivered to the purchaser in
22		time for the purchaser to attend the event; and

- 14 §481B-E Ticket brokers; fees; cancellation. (a) No
- 15 ticket broker shall charge a fee for the use of a credit card to
- 16 purchase tickets without first disclosing that a fee will be
- 17 charged and the fee amount.
- 18 (b) A ticket broker shall refund any and all service fees
- 19 charged for the purchase of a ticket when the public exhibition,
- 20 game, contest, or performance for which the ticket was purchased
- 21 is canceled.

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1 (c) For the purposes of this section, "ticket broker" 2 means any person whose primary business purpose is selling or 3 reselling tickets of admission or any other evidence of right of 4 entry to a theater, place of amusement or entertainment, or 5 other place where public exhibitions, games, contests, or 6 performances are held." 7 SECTION 3. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended by adding a new section to part IX to be appropriately 9 designated and to read as follows: 10 "§708- Circumvention of online ticket purchase processes. (a) No person shall use computer software to 11 **12**· circumvent a security measure, access control system, or other 13 control or measure on a ticket seller's website that is used to 14 ensure an equitable process for purchasing tickets. 15 (b) A person found in violation of this section shall be 16 guilty of a misdemeanor. 17 (c) For purposes of this section, "ticket" means any 18 ticket of admission or any other evidence of a right of entry to 19 an exhibition, game, contest, athletic competition, concert, 20 performance, or any other event taking place in the State." 21 SECTION 4. Section 440-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

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amended to read as follows:

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"\$440-17 Admission tickets. All tickets of admission to 1 2 any boxing contest for which admission fees are charged and 3 received shall have printed clearly upon the face thereof the 4 purchase price of same, and no ticket shall be sold [for more 5 than the price as printed thereon.] in a manner that violates 6 section 481B-B." 7 SECTION 5. Section 440E-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 8 9 "[+]\$440E-13[+] Admission tickets. All tickets of 10 admission to any mixed martial arts contest for which admission 11 fees are charged and received shall have printed clearly upon 12 the face thereof the purchase price of same, and no ticket shall 13 be sold [for more than the price as printed thereon.] in a 14 manner that violates section 481B-B." 15 SECTION 6. Section 481B-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 repealed. 17 ["[\$481B-15] Ticket brokers; fees; cancellation. (a) No ticket broker shall charge a fee for the use of a credit card to 18 19 purchase tickets without first disclosing that a fee will be 20 charged. 21 (b) A ticket broker shall refund any and all service fees 22 charged for the purchase of a ticket when the public exhibition,

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- 1 game, contest, or performance for which the ticket was purchased
- 2 is canceled.
- 3 (c) For the purposes of this section, "ticket broker"
- 4 means any person engaged in the business of selling tickets of
- 5 admission or any other evidence of right of entry to a theater,
- 6 place of amusement or entertainment, or other place where public
- 7 exhibitions, games, contests, or performances are held, at a
- 8 price greater than the price printed on the ticket."]
- 9 SECTION 7. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 10 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 11 begun before its effective date.
- 12 SECTION 8. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 13 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 14 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 15 the new sections in this Act.
- 16 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 18 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2112.

Event Ticket Sales Practices; Ticket Scalping; Price Limitations; Website Sales Requirements; Disclosures; Remedies; Unfair and Deceptive Practices; Circumvention of Online Ticket Purchase Processes

Description:

Prohibits the sale of tickets to an exhibition, game, concert, and other events at prices greater than the sum of the price printed on the ticket, any lawful taxes collected, and any reasonable charge for services. Specifies that no ticket sales for events in Hawaii shall commence before 8:00 a.m. Hawaiian standard time or before the primary ticket seller commences ticket sales, whichever is later. Specifies requirements for tickets sold or offered for sale by or through an internet website. Establishes requirements for disclosures relating to fees and taxes and number of available tickets. Establishes remedies. Makes the circumvention of online ticket purchases through the use of illicit computer software a misdemeanor. Effective 7/1/2112. (SD2)

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
