A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONTINUING EDUCATION FOR MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPISTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the profession of
- 2 marriage and family therapy has been regulated in the State
- 3 since 1998. Unlike other licensed professions, continuing
- 4 education credit hours are not currently required for marriage
- 5 and family therapists to renew their licenses.
- 6 The legislature further finds that marriage and family
- 7 therapists provide critically needed services in prevention,
- 8 intervention, and treatment to a broad spectrum of clients. It
- 9 is therefore essential that marriage and family therapists
- 10 maintain their professional competency and keep abreast of the
- 11 latest developments in their profession.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to require licensed marriage and
- 13 family therapists in Hawaii to complete a minimum of forty-five
- 14 credit hours of continuing education courses during each
- 15 licensing renewal triennium, beginning January 1, 2017.

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 451J-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding three new definitions to be appropriately
- 3 inserted and to read as follows:
- 4 ""Continuing education courses" means courses approved by
- 5 the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy,
- 6 American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy: Hawaii
- 7 Division, American Psychological Association, Hawaii
- 8 Psychological Association, National Association of Social
- 9 Workers, or National Board for Certified Counselors and
- 10 Affiliates, Inc.
- "Credit hour" means, except as otherwise provided, the
- 12 value assigned to fifty minutes of instruction.
- "Ethic courses" include ethic theory, ethical reasoning,
- 14 ethical principles, ethical dilemmas, and professional ethics."
- 15 SECTION 3. Section 451J-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 "[+]§451J-10[+] Renewal of license. (a) Licenses shall
- 18 be renewed triennially on or before December 31, with the first
- 19 renewal deadline occurring on December 31, 2001. Failure to
- 20 renew a license shall result in a forfeiture of the license.
- 21 Licenses which have been forfeited may be restored within one
- 22 year of the expiration date upon payment of renewal and



1	restoration fees[-], and in the case of audited marriage and	
2	family therapists, documentation of continuing education	
3	compliance. Failure to restore a forfeited license within one	
4	year of the date of its expiration shall result in the automat	ic
5	termination of the license. Persons with terminated licenses	
6	shall be required to reapply for licensure as a new applicant.	
7	(b) Beginning with the renewal for the licensing trienning	<u>um</u>
8	commencing on January 1, 2017, through December 31, 2019, and	
9	prior to every triennial renewal thereafter, each licensee	
10	shall:	
11	(1) Pay all required fees; and	
12	(2) Complete a minimum of forty-five credit hours of	
13	continuing education courses within the three-year	
14	period preceding the renewal date; provided that a	
15	minimum of six credit hours shall be in ethic course	s.
16	(c) A first time licensee shall not be subject to the	
17	continuing education requirement for the first license renewal	<u>.</u>
18	(d) Each licensee shall maintain the licensee's continuit	ng
19	education records. At the time of renewal, each licensee shal	1
20	certify under oath that the licensee has complied with the	
21	continuing education requirement of this section. The director	r
22	may require a licensee to submit evidence satisfactory to the

1	director	that demonstrates compliance with the continuing
2	education	requirement of this section.
3	<u>(e)</u>	A licensee seeking renewal of a license without full
4	complianc	e with the continuing education requirement shall
5	submit th	e renewal application, required fee, a notarized
6	affidavit	setting forth the facts explaining the reasons for
7	noncompli	ance, and a request for an extension on the basis of
8	the facts	; provided that the licensee shall complete at least
9	ninety ho	urs of continuing education, including at least twelve
10	hours in	ethic courses, prior to the next licensing triennium.
11	The direc	tor shall consider each case on an individual basis and
12	may grant	an extension of the continuing education requirement
13	based on:	
14	(1)	Practice in an isolated geographical area with an
15		absence of opportunities for continuing education by
16		taped programs or otherwise; or
17	(2)	Inability to devote sufficient hours to continuing
18		education because of incapacity, undue hardship, or
19		any other serious extenuating circumstances.
20	<u>(f)</u>	The director may conduct random audits of licensees to
21	determine	compliance with the continuing education requirement.
22	The direc	tor shall provide written notice of an audit to a

1	licensee randomly selected for audit. Within sixty days of
2	notification, the licensee shall provide the director with
3	documentation verifying compliance with the continuing education
4	requirement established by this section."
5	SECTION 4. Section 451J-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
7	"(a) The department shall deny, revoke, condition, or
8	suspend a license granted pursuant to this chapter on the
9	following grounds:
10	(1) Conviction by a court of competent jurisdiction of a
11	crime which the department has determined, by rules
12	adopted pursuant to chapter 91, to be of a nature that
13	renders the person convicted unfit to practice
14	marriage and family therapy;
15	(2) Failing to report in writing to the director any
16	disciplinary decision related to the provision of
17	mental health services issued against the licensee or
18	the applicant in any jurisdiction within thirty days
19	of the disciplinary decision, or within thirty days of

licensure;

1	(3)	Violation of recognized ethical standards for marriage
2		and family therapists as set by the [association;]
3		American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy;
4	(4)	Fraud or misrepresentation in obtaining a license;
5	(5)	Revocation, suspension, or other disciplinary action
6		by any state or federal agency against a licensee or
7		applicant for any reason provided under this section;
8		[or]
9	(6)	Other just and sufficient cause which renders a person
10		unfit to practice marriage and family therapy[-]; or
11	<u>(7)</u>	Making a false claim on any document submitted or
12		required to be filed by this chapter, including a
13		false certification of compliance with the continuing
14		education requirement."
