# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONTINUING EDUCATION FOR MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPISTS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the profession of
- 2 marriage and family therapy has been regulated in the State
- 3 since 1998. Unlike other licensed professions, continuing
- 4 education credit hours are not currently required for marriage
- 5 and family therapists to renew their licenses.
- 6 The legislature further finds that marriage and family
- 7 therapists provide critically needed services in prevention,
- 8 intervention, and treatment to a broad spectrum of clients. It
- 9 is therefore essential that marriage and family therapists
- 10 maintain their professional competency and keep abreast of the
- 11 latest developments in their profession.
- The purpose of this Act is to require licensed marriage and
- 13 family therapists in Hawaii to complete a minimum of forty-five
- 14 credit hours of continuing education courses during each
- 15 licensing renewal triennium, beginning January 1, 2017.

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 451J-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding three new definitions to be appropriately
- 3 inserted and to read as follows:
- 4 ""Continuing education courses" means courses approved by
- 5 the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy,
- 6 American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy: Hawaii
- 7 Division, American Psychological Association, Hawaii
- 8 Psychological Association, National Association of Social
- 9 Workers, or National Board for Certified Counselors and
- 10 Affiliates, Inc.
- "Credit hour" means, except as otherwise provided, the
- 12 value assigned to fifty minutes of instruction.
- "Ethics courses" include ethics theory, ethical reasoning,
- 14 ethical principles, ethical dilemmas, and professional ethics."
- 15 SECTION 3. Section 451J-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- "[+]\$451J-10[+] Renewal of license. (a) Licenses shall
- 18 be renewed triennially on or before December 31, with the first
- 19 renewal deadline occurring on December 31, 2001. Failure to
- 20 renew a license shall result in a forfeiture of the license.
- 21 Licenses [which] that have been forfeited may be restored within
- 22 one year of the expiration date upon payment of renewal and

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- restoration fees [-], and in the case of marriage and family 1 therapists audited pursuant to subsection (f), documentation of 2 continuing education compliance. Failure to restore a forfeited 3 license within one year of the date of its expiration shall 4 result in the automatic termination of the license. Persons 5 with terminated licenses shall be required to reapply for 6 7 licensure as a new applicant. (b) Beginning with the renewal for the licensing triennium 8 commencing on January 1, 2017, through December 31, 2019, and 9 prior to every triennial renewal thereafter, each licensee 10 11 shall: (1) Pay all required fees; and 12 (2) Complete a minimum of forty-five credit hours of 13 continuing education courses within the three-year 14 period preceding the renewal date; provided that a 15 minimum of six credit hours shall be in ethics 16 17 courses. (c) A first-time licensee shall not be subject to the 18 19 continuing education requirement established under subsection 20 (b)(2) for the first license renewal. Each licensee shall maintain the licensee's continuing 21 education records. At the time of renewal, each licensee shall 22
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1	certify under oath that the licensee has complied with	the	
2	continuing education requirement of this section. The	director	
3	may require a licensee to submit evidence satisfactory	to the	
4	director that demonstrates compliance with the continuing		
5	education requirement of this section.		
6	(e) A licensee seeking renewal of a license without full		
7	compliance with the continuing education requirement shall		
8	submit the renewal application, required fee, a notarized		
9	affidavit setting forth the facts explaining the reason	s for	
10	noncompliance, and a request for an extension on the basis of		
11	the facts; provided that the licensee shall complete at least		
12	ninety hours of continuing education, including at least twelve		
13	hours in ethics courses, prior to the next licensing tr	iennium.	
14	The director shall consider each case on an individual basis ar		
15	may grant an extension of the continuing education requirement		
16	based upon:		
17	(1) Practice in an isolated geographical area wit	h an	
18	absence of opportunities for continuing educa	tion by	
19	taped programs or otherwise; or		
20	(2) Inability to devote sufficient hours to conti	nuing	
21	education because of incapacity, undue hardship, or		
22	any other serious extenuating circumstances.	•	

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1	<u>(f)</u>	The director may conduct random audits of licensees to	
2	determine	compliance with the continuing education requirement.	
3	The direc	tor shall provide written notice of an audit to a	
4	licensee	randomly selected for audit. Within sixty days of	
5	notificat	ion, the licensee shall provide the director with	
6	documenta	tion verifying compliance with the continuing education	
7	requirement established by this section."		
8	SECT	ION 4. Section 451J-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
9	amended by	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:	
10	"(a)	The department shall deny, revoke, condition, or	
11	suspend a	license granted pursuant to this chapter on the	
12	following	grounds:	
13	(1)	Conviction by a court of competent jurisdiction of a	
14		crime which the department has determined, by rules	
15		adopted pursuant to chapter 91, to be of a nature that	
16		renders the person convicted unfit to practice	
17		marriage and family therapy;	
18	(2)	Failing to report in writing to the director any	
19		disciplinary decision related to the provision of	
20	•	mental health services issued against the licensee or	
21		the applicant in any jurisdiction within thirty days	

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1		of the disciplinary decision, or within thirty days of	
2		licensure;	
3	(3)	Violation of recognized ethical standards for marriage	
4	•	and family therapists as set by the association;	
5	(4)	Fraud or misrepresentation in obtaining or renewing a	
6		license;	
7	(5)	Revocation, suspension, or other disciplinary action	
8		by any state or federal agency against a licensee or	
9		applicant for any reason provided under this section;	
10		[ <del>or</del> ]	
11	(6)	Other just and sufficient cause which renders a person	
12		unfit to practice marriage and family therapy[-]; or	
13	(7)	Submission or filing of a document that falsely	
14		certifies one's compliance with the continuing	
15		education requirement set forth in section 451J-10."	
16	SECT	ION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed	
17	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.		
18	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.		

### Report Title:

Marriage and Family Therapists; Continuing Education

### Description:

Requires licensed marriage and family therapists to complete a minimum of forty-five hours of continuing education courses, including six hours in ethics courses, during each licensing renewal period, for the period beginning 1/1/2017, and thereafter. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)
