A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CANCER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that after Congress
2	passed the Breast and Cervical Cancer Mortality Prevention Act
3	in 1990, which led to the creation of cancer screening programs
4	in all fifty states, the Hawaii breast and cervical cancer
5	control program was established in 1993. Since 1997, the Hawaii
6	breast and cervical cancer control program has screened more
7	than 7,600 women.
8	Over the past few years, the program has screened
9	approximately 1,275 women each year. Despite the loss of one of
10	its providers, Hawaii Medical Center, the program anticipates
11	that it will continue screening between one thousand one hundred
12	to one thousand two hundred women annually.
13	The legislature further finds that according to the
14	department of human services med-QUEST division, from July 2010
15	to June 2011, the State paid a total of \$80,487.47 for eight
16	women under the comprehensive breast and cervical cancer control

program, which averages \$10,060.93 per person. Even though the

amount of expenditures varies from quarter to quarter and year

- 1 to year, and depends on the number and severity of each medical
- 2 case, based on the number of women the comprehensive breast and
- 3 cervical cancer control program has screened annually and the
- 4 available data from the department of human services, \$100,000
- 5 would be the estimated amount needed for comprehensive treatment
- 6 in the State.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for the
- 8 comprehensive breast and cervical cancer control program to
- 9 continue its valuable breast and cervical cancer screening,
- 10 education, treatment, and outreach services.
- 11 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 13 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for
- 14 the comprehensive breast and cervical cancer control program.
- 15 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 16 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
