A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SOLID WASTE REDUCTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State should 2 lead by example while moving toward a more environmentally 3 sustainable future. An effective way to accomplish increased 4 environmental sustainability is to diminish the need for 5 landfills by diverting food and green waste from landfills to 6 composting and energy production. 7 The purpose of this Act is to continue the progress to 8 long-term environmental sustainability by authorizing the Hawaii 9 public housing authority to enter into contracts with private 10 businesses to remove food and green waste from the waste stream 11 for use in other business sectors, including agriculture and 12 energy generation. SECTION 2. Section 356D-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 14 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

- 16 (1)Sue and be sued;
- Have a seal and alter the same at pleasure; 17 (2)
