#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ETHICS CODE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 84-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended to read as follows:

3 "§84-12 Confidential information. No legislator or employee shall disclose information which by law or practice is 4 5 not available to the public and which the legislator or employee acquires in the course of the legislator's or employee's 6 7 official duties, or use the information for the legislator's or 8 employee's personal gain or for the benefit of anyone [; provided 9 that this section-shall not preclude a person who serves as the 10 designee or representative of an entity that is a member of a 11 task force from disclosing information to the entity which the 12 person acquires as the entity's designee or representative]." 13 SECTION 2. Section 84-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 14 15 "§84-13 Fair treatment. No legislator or employee shall 16 use or attempt to use the legislator's or employee's official

17 position to secure or grant unwarranted privileges, exemptions,

14		or a person or business whom the legislator or
15		employee inspects or supervises in the legislator's or
16		employee's official capacity.
17	Noth	ing herein shall be construed to prohibit a legislator
18	from intro	oducing bills and resolutions, [ <del>or to prevent a person</del>
19	from serving on a task force or from] serving on [a task force]	
20	[committee,] committees, or from making statements or taking	
21	[ <del>official</del>	] action [ <del>as a legislator, or a task force member or a</del>
22	<del>task forc</del>	e member's designee or representative. Every
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1	lcgislator, or task force member or designee or representative
2	of a task force member shall file a full and complete public
3	disclosure of the nature and extent of the interest or
4	transaction-which-the-legislator or task force member or task
5	force member's designee or representative believes may be
6	affected by the legislator's or task force member's official
7	action.] in the exercise of the legislator's legislative
8	functions."
9	SECTION 3. Section 84-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended by amending subsection (f) to read as follows:
11	"(f) [ <del>Subsections-(a), (b), and</del> ] <u>Subsection</u> (d) shall not
12	apply to a task force member or the designee or representative
13	of that task force member whose service as a task force member
14	would not otherwise cause that member, designee, or
15	representative to be considered an employee[ <del>, if the task force</del>
16	member or the designee or representative of that task force
17	member complies with the disclosure requirements under section
18	84-17]."
19	SECTION 4. Section 84-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
20	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
21	"(b) A state agency shall not enter into a contract with
22	any person or business which is represented or assisted
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1	personally in the matter by a person who has been an employee of		
2	the agency within the preceding two years and who participated		
3	while in state office or employment in the matter with which the		
4	contract is directly concerned. [This subsection-shall not		
5	apply to any contract that is awarded in accordance with		
6	subsection (a) with a person or business represented or assisted		
7	by a person who was a member of a task force or served as the		
8	designee or representative of a task force member.]"		
9	SECTION 5. Section 84-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
10	amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:		
11	"(c) The following persons shall file annually with the		
12	state ethics commission a disclosure of financial interests:		
13	(1) The governor, the lieutenant governor, the members of		
14	the legislature, and delegates to the constitutional		
15	convention; provided that delegates to the		
16	constitutional convention shall only be required to		
17	file initial disclosures;		
18	(2) The directors and their deputies, the division chiefs,		
19	the executive directors and the executive secretaries		
20	and their deputies, the purchasing agents and the		
21	fiscal officers, regardless of the titles by which the		



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1		foregoing persons are designated, of every state
2		agency and department;
3	(3)	The permanent employees of the legislature and its
4		service agencies, other than persons employed in
5		clerical, secretarial, or similar positions;
6	(4)	The administrative director of the State, and the
7		assistants in the office of the governor and the
8		lieutenant governor, other than persons employed in
9		clerical, secretarial, or similar positions;
10	(5)	The hearings officers of every state agency and
11		department;
12	(6)	The president, the vice presidents, assistant vice
13		presidents, the chancellors, and the provosts of the
14		University of Hawaii and its community colleges;
15	(7)	The superintendent, the deputy superintendent, the
16		assistant superintendents, the complex area
17		superintendents, the state librarian, and the deputy
18		state librarian of the department of education;
19	(8)	The administrative director and the deputy director of
20		the courts;



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1	(9)	The members of every state board or commission whose
2		original terms of office are for periods exceeding one
3		year and whose functions are not solely advisory;
4	(10)	Candidates for state elective offices, including
5		candidates for election to the constitutional
6		convention, provided that candidates shall only be
7		required to file initial disclosures; [ <del>and</del> ]
8	(11)	The administrator and assistant administrator of the
9		office of Hawaiian affairs[-]; and
10	(12)	Members of task forces."
11	SECT	ION 6. Section 84-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended b	y amending subsection (d) to read as follows:
13	"(d)	The financial disclosure statements of the following
14	persons s	hall be public records and available for inspection and
15	duplicati	on:
16	(1)	The governor, the lieutenant governor, the members of
17		the legislature, candidates for and delegates to the
18		constitutional convention, the trustees of the office
19		of Hawaiian affairs, and candidates for state elective
20		offices;
21	(2)	The directors of the state departments and their

deputies, regardless of the titles by which the

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1		foregoing persons are designated; provided that with
2		respect to the department of the attorney general, the
3		foregoing shall apply only to the attorney general and
4		the first deputy attorney general;
5	(3)	The administrative director of the State;
6	(4)	The president, the vice presidents, the assistant vice
7		presidents, the chancellors, and the provosts of the
8		University of Hawaii;
9	(5)	The members of the board of education and the
10		superintendent, the deputy superintendent, the state
11		librarian, and the deputy state librarian of the
12		department of education;
13	(6)	The administrative director and the deputy director of
14		the courts; [and]
15	(7)	The administrator and the assistant administrator of
16		the office of Hawaiian affairs[-]; and
17	(8)	Members of task forces."
