## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DIABETES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is						
2	amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately						
3	designated and to read as follows:						
4	"§321- Diabetes reporting. (a) The department of						
5	health, in collaboration with the department of human services						
6	and the department of human resources development, shall						
7	identify goals and benchmarks and develop departmental plans to						
8	reduce the incidence of diabetes in the State, improve diabetes						
9	care, and reduce complications associated with diabetes.						
10	(b) The department of health, in collaboration with the						
11	department of human services and the department of human						
12	resources development, shall submit a biennial report to the						
13	legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of						
14	the applicable regular session on the following:						
15	(1) The health, societal, and financial impacts that						
16	diabetes of all types has on the State, counties, the						
17	department of health, the department of human						

1		services, and the department of human resources					
2		development, including:					
3	•	(A)	The number of individuals with diabetes who				
4			require services from, or who fall within the				
5			purview of, the department of health, the				
6			department of human services, and the department				
7			of human resources development;				
8		<u>(B)</u>	The number of participants in diabetes education,				
9			prevention, and treatment programs administered				
10		,	by the department of health, the department of				
11			human services, and the department of human				
12			resources development;				
13		(C)	The costs associated with diabetes education,				
14			prevention, and treatment programs administered				
15			by the department of health; the department of				
16			human services, including medicaid; and the				
17			department of human resources development; and				
18		<u>(D)</u>	The costs to the department of health, the				
19			department of human services, and the department				
20			of human resources development associated with				
21	٠		diabetes education, prevention, and treatment as				
22			compared to the costs associated with education,				

1		prevention, and treatment concerning other				
2		chronic diseases;				
3	(2)	An assessment of the effectiveness of diabetes				
4		education and treatment activities, including the				
5		amount and source of any funding appropriated by the				
6		legislature for these activities;				
7	(3)	A description of the level of coordination between the				
8		department of health and the department of human				
9		services on activities to manage, treat, and prevent				
10		diabetes and associated complications; and				
11	(4)	Any proposed legislation intended to reduce the impact				
12		of diabetes, pre-diabetes, and related diabetes				
13		complications in Hawaii, including recommended				
14		appropriations; provided that the report shall				
15		identify expected outcomes of the proposed				
16		<u>legislation.</u> "				
17	SECT	ION 2. The provisions of section 1 of this Act shall				
18	be limited	d to the diabetes information, data, initiatives, and				
19	programs	within each department prior to the effective date of				
<b>20</b> \	this Act,	unless unencumbered funding exists in each agency that				
21	may be used for new research, data collection, reporting, or					
22	other provisions of section 1 of this Act.
