RELATING TO WATER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Section 340E-4.8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "[+]\$340E-4.8[+] Water catchment systems. (a) The 4 department shall establish a program to conduct annual testing 5 of water from water catchment systems [for lead and copper.], upon request by a resident of the property on which a water 7 catchment system is located, to determine whether the system 8 meets the water and water or waste disposal system requirements 9 for federal rural housing loans pursuant to title 7 Code of Federal Regulations section 1980.313(c). Any resident residing 10 11 in a legal dwelling [which] that relies on a water catchment 12 system for the resident's water needs shall be eligible to participate in the program, subject to the department's 13 14 procedures and guidelines and the availability of program funds. Residents shall utilize a certified private analytical 15 16 laboratory specified by the department or the department may 17 conduct the tests. Participating residents shall pay [\$25] 18 for the tests [and the department shall cover the

- remainder of the testing-cost]. One set of tests a year for 1
- 2 each legal dwelling may be requested under this program.
- 3 The department shall establish procedures and
- 4 guidelines for the [testing] program, which shall:
- Identify sampling and analytical protocols[+] for 5 (1)6 testing;
- 7 Specify report and notice requirements; [and] (2)
- Determine participation eligibility procedures and 8 (3) requirements[-]; and 9
- (4) Require, upon request, the submission of written 10 11 verification by the department that a water catchment system is approved or that it complies with the Safe 12 Water Drinking Act (42 U.S.C. 300F et seq.) and the 13 14 Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. 1251 et seq.), if
- 16 The department shall establish a nonregulatory program that provides technical assistance to any resident residing in a 17 legal dwelling [which] that relies on a water catchment system 18 for the resident's water needs for the purpose of improving 19 water quality in that system. To the extent practicable, the 20 department shall assist the resident by recommending practical 21 and affordable methods to improve water quality, based on the
