A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELDERLY EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "\$304A- Senior citizen education. (a) The University
- 5 of Hawaii shall encourage Hawaii's senior citizens to continue
- 6 their education by offering to senior citizens, at all
- 7 University of Hawaii campuses, credited courses at no cost or a
- 8 discounted tuition rate based upon the financial status of the
- 9 senior citizen.
- 10 For the purposes of this section, "senior citizen" means a
- 11 resident of this State who:
- (1) Is at least sixty-five years of age at the time of
- 13 enrollment; and
- 14 (2) Is not incarcerated at a correctional facility."
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 304A-502, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- "[+]\$304A-502[+] Power of regents to grant tuition
- 18 waivers. The board of regents, or its designated
